(8) Briefly explain the regulation in clear and nontechnical language.

Chapter 21 governs the conduct of persons visiting or using State Forest land. It has not been revised for more than 25 years. In their current form, the rules and regulations are badly outdated and are no longer sufficient to allow the Department to protect and control the use of State Forest land. The recreation and commercial use of State Forest land has increased dramatically in the last quarter century and these revisions are sorely needed.

(9) State the statutory authority for the regulation and any relevant state or federal court decisions.

The Conservation and Natural Resources Act, (71 P.S. §§1340.313); and the Crimes Code, 18 Pa C.S. §§7505 and 7506, unless otherwise noted. There are no relevant state or federal court decisions.

Regulatory Analysis Form

(10) Is the regulation mandated by any federal or state law or court order, or federal regulation? If yes, cite the specific law, case or regulation, and any deadlines for action.

Yes. The Department is required by Section 313 of the Conservation and Natural Resource Act, 71 P.S. §1340.313, to promulgate regulations for the control, management, protection, utilization, development and use of the lands and resources of State Forests as it may deem necessary or proper to conserve the interests of the Commonwealth, and as necessary to carry out the act.

(11) Explain the compelling public interest that justifies the regulation. What is the problem it addresses?

The rules & regulations which govern conduct on State Forest land have not been revised for more than 25 years. In their current form, they are badly out-dated and are no longer sufficient to allow the Department to protect and manage the use of State Forest land or to adequately insure the safety of visitors. The recreational and commercial use of State Forest land has increased dramatically over the last quarter century and these revisions are sorely needed.

(12) State the public health, safety, environmental or general welfare risks associated with non-regulation.

Non-regulation would lead to increased risk to State Forest visitors as well as pollution and severe damage to the environment.

(13) Describe who will benefit from the regulation. (Quantify the benefits as completely as possible and approximate the number of people who will benefit.)

The revisions to the State Forest Rules and Regulations will provide for improved protection of the forest resource and to the public recreating on State Forest land. Therefore, all citizens of the Commonwealth will benefit from their adoption.

(14) Describe who will be adversely affected by the regulation. (Quantify the adverse effect as completely as possible and approximate the number of people who will be adversely affected.)

It is not expected that anyone will be adversely affected.

(15) List the persons, groups or entities that will be required to comply with the regulation. (Approximate the number of people who will be required to comply.)

All visitors to State Forest land will be required to comply with the rules and regulations. Examples of visitors include hikers, hunters, snowmobilers, cross-country skiers, campers, equestrians and bird-watchers.

(16) Describe the communications with and inputs from the public in the development and drafting of the regulation. List the persons and/or groups who were involved, if applicable.

The public was invited to submit comments during a 60-day period after publication of the proposed rulemaking on September 13, 1997. In addition, the Department's Advisory Council and the House and Senate Environmental Resources and Energy Committees and the Independent Regulatory Review Commission had the opportunity to comment on the proposed rulemaking. The Department also held 19 public meetings across the Commonwealth from September to November 1997, to explain the proposed rulemaking and to respond to questions. In addition, the Department issued many press releases to inform the public about the proposed rulemaking.

(17) Provide a specific estimate of the cost and/or savings to the regulated community associated with compliance, including any legal, accounting or consulting procedures which may be required.

Since no fees are charged in conjunction with the use of State Forest land, there will be no additional cost to State Forest visitors.



State Forests

Order

The Secretary, Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, by this order amends 17 Pa. Code, Chapter 21 (relating to general provisions). The amendments will modernize the State Forest regulations which have not been updated in more than 25 years. The amendments will allow the Department to better manage the use of State Forest land and to protect fragile ecosystems.

A. Effective Date

These proposed amendments will go into effect upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* as final rulemaking.

C. Statutory Authority

The final rulemaking is being made under the authority of section 313 of the Conservation and Natural Resources Act (71 P. S. §§ 1340.102–1340.1103) which directs the Department to formulate, adopt and promulgate regulations regarding conduct on State Forest land.

D. Background and Purpose

The regulations which govern conduct on State Forest land have not been revised for more than 25 years. In their current form, they are badly outdated and are no longer sufficient to allow the Department adequately to protect and control the use of State Forest land. The recreational and commercial use of State Forest land has increased dramatically in the last quarter century and these revisions are sorely needed.

The public was invited to submit comments during a 60-day period after publication of the proposed rulemaking on September 13, 1997. In addition, the Department's Advisory Council and the House and Senate Environmental Resources and Energy Committees and the Independent Regulatory Review Commission had the opportunity to comment on the proposed rulemaking. The Department also held 19 public meetings across the Commonwealth from September to November, 1997, to explain the proposed rulemaking and to respond to questions. In addition, the Department issued many press releases to inform the public about the proposed rulemaking.

E. Summary of Comments and Responses on the Proposed Rulemaking

The Department received comments from 1,195 commentators on the proposed rulemaking. Commentators included private citizens, other agencies, legislators and the Independent Regulatory Review Commission.

The following is a discussion of significant comments received.

Sec. 21.1 Definitions

The commentator suggested revising the definition of "commercial activity" to read, "An activity in which a person, organization or association directly or indirectly"

The Department agrees with this suggestion and has changed the wording accordingly.

Sec. 21.1 Definitions

The commentators stated that the definition of "Group Activity" is unclear and ask if group activities include groups of hunters, hikers, etc.

For an activity to fall under the definition of "group activity," three criteria must be met. It must be a scheduled event; it must require a large land area or unique land formation; AND it must have the potential to conflict with traditional uses of State Forest land or pose a potential threat to the environment. Small groups of persons engaged in hunting or hiking would not ordinarily be included in this definition.

Sec. 21.12(b) Mooring and Launching

Section 21.12(b), in its proposed form, would not require launch permits on rivers and streams flowing through State Forest land. The commentator suggested revising the language to include rivers and streams.

The Department agrees. At the time the rulemaking was proposed, there were no launching facilities on rivers and streams on State Forest land. Therefore, the words "lakes and ponds" were substituted for the word "waters." However, since that time, launching facilities have been constructed on State Forest land giving access to the Susquehanna and Juniata Rivers and others are proposed. Therefore, the original word, "waters," has been retained so that the section includes all bodies of water on State Forest land.

Sec. 21.12(d) Mooring and Launching

In proposed rulemaking, the fee schedule for mooring and launching permits appearing in Section 21.12(d) of the current regulations was deleted and replaced with a new provision concerning the launching of boats. The reason for the deletion of the fee schedule was the intention to publish it in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* rather than promulgating it as a regulation. However, the Department inadvertently omitted any reference in the proposed rulemaking to the fact that fees will continue to be charged for mooring and launching permits and that the fee schedule will be published in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin*. Thus, in final rulemaking, the Department is including this reference to fees in subsection (d). The new provision concerning the launching of boats that had been inserted in proposed subsection (d) is now being moved to subsection (e), and the provision that was in proposed subsection (e) is now subsection (f).

Sec. 21.12(d) (subsection (e) in final rulemaking) Mooring and Launching

The commentator suggested adding wording to Section 21.12(d) (subsection (e) in final rulemaking) to prohibit launching of boats from private docks without the owner's permission.

The Department has not added the suggested provision. The Department does not have the duty or power to enforce private property rights.

Sec. 21.25 Parking

The commentator requested that wording be added to Section 21.25 that would prohibit an able-bodied vehicle operator from parking in designated handicapped parking areas.

The Department agrees with this suggestion. New language has been added accordingly.

Section 21.26(1) Horses and Pack Animals

Section 21.27(1) Bicycles and Person-Powered Vehicles

Many commentators expressed concern with the provisions prohibiting use of horses, pack animals, bicycles and person-powered vehicles on National and State Forest Designated Hiking Trails unless posted as being open to their use. They felt that these provisions unreasonably favor one recreational use (hiking) to the disadvantage of other uses.

Many other commentators supported the provisions, claiming that these other uses, particularly horseback riding, damage trails meant for hiking.

There are two National Hiking Trails and 18 State Forest Designated Hiking Trails in the Commonwealth. The proposed regulations would impose the assumption that these trails would be closed for horses, pack animals, bicycles and person-powered vehicles unless posted as being open. In view of the controversy and confusion generated by these proposed regulations, the Department is deleting them from the proposed rulemaking. The Department intends to revisit these issues and will redraft these regulations regarding the use of horses and mountain bikes on State Forest land in consultation with a work group to be made up of interested groups and individuals. Meanwhile, the Department retains its authority under Section 21.71 to post trails and other areas as being closed to certain uses.

Sec. 21.31(1) Prohibitions

The commentators suggested including a prohibition of planting exotic, invasive plant species. Further, one of the commentators suggested that paragraph (1) be changed by deleting the words, "berries, nuts, leeks and mushrooms" and substituting the words "edible wild plants or plant parts . . ."

The Department agrees with these comments and has made the suggested revisions.

Sec. 21.61 Camping Permit

The commentator suggested moving the definition of camping to Section 21.1, *Definitions*.

The Department agrees. The definition has been moved to Section 21.1.

Sec. 21.61 Camping Permit

The commentators objected to Section 21.61 in requiring primitive backpack campers to obtain a camping permit on the grounds that it is overly restrictive and often difficult to conveniently obtain a permit with short notice.

The Department will retain the existing wording in this section so that backpackers may camp without first obtaining a camping permit.

Sec. 21.62 Open fires

The commentators suggested adding a provision at the end of Section 21.62 to the effect that this restriction does not apply to small self-contained camp stoves when used in a safe manner.

The Department agrees with this suggestion and has added the wording.

Sec. 21.62 Open Fires

The commentators object to Section 21.62(b) prohibiting open fires from March 1 to May 25 and from October 1 to December 1

without authorization from the District Forester.

The Department did not make the suggested change. The spring and fall months are the highest fire danger months of the year. The Bureau of Forestry's field staff has been pointing out the need for this prohibition for many years. The District Forester's authorization for an open fire during these months is easy to obtain. A telephone call to a forest district office is all that is necessary since the authorization need not be in writing.

Sec. 21.65 Target Shooting

Since most of the commentators felt this section would allow target shooting virtually anywhere on State Forest land the wording in Section 21.65 is apparently subject to too broad an interpretation.

The Department has changed this section to prohibit target shooting except where authorized by the District Forester.

Sec. 21.70a Snow Plowing

The commentators feel that Section 21.70a, which prohibits snow plowing on State Forest roads without the approval of the District Forester, may lead to denying access to property owners.

The suggested change has not been made. The Department does not intend to deny access to any person with a legitimate need. However, it is important that the Department has control over how State Forest roads are plowed. Plowing snow from crowned earthen roads will lead to serious road damage if not done properly. Moreover, many of the State Forest roads are also part of the snowmobile system. It is important that roads be plowed in such a way that this sport is not adversely impacted. However, the wording of the section has been modified so that the District Forester's oral authorization is sufficient.

Sec. 21.71 Closure

The commentator suggests that since many provisions of this chapter refer to closure of portions of State Forest land for certain activities or times of year, additional emphasis be placed on this section by moving it to a more prominent location under PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS.

The Department agrees. This section has been relocated and re-numbered as Section 21.4.

Sec. 21.74 Disorderly Conduct

The commentators suggested that a provision be added prohibiting loud noise that might disturb other visitors to State Forest land.

The Department agrees with this comment and has added Paragraph (3) to Section 21.74.

Sec. 21.75 Sanitation

The commentators suggested that this section is too confusing and too restrictive in its proposed form.

The Department agrees with this comment and has re-written the section accordingly.

Sec. 21.76(a) Feeding of Wildlife

The commentators felt that Section 21.76 (a) should be changed to allow the summer feeding of wildlife.

The Department did not make the suggested change. Comments from the Pennsylvania Game Commission, including one from that agency's chief game biologist, state that artificial feeding of wildlife is unnecessary and may actually harm wildlife.

Sec. 21.76 Feeding of Wildlife

The commentators suggested prohibiting artificial feeding of wildlife, except for songbirds. The commentators felt that artificial feeding of wildlife is unnecessary and possibly harmful to wildlife.

The Department did not make this change. Although the Pennsylvania Game Commission discourages artificial feeding of wildlife, many sportsmen have a tradition of feeding wildlife, especially in the winter months. An outright prohibition of this activity would be opposed by a large number of people. Instead, with the Game Commission's assistance, the Department will attempt to educate the public concerning the detrimental aspects of artificial feeding.

Sec. 21.76(b) Feeding of Wildlife

The commentator suggested that the prohibition be against placing of feeders that have a single or combined capacity of more than one-half bushel.

The Department agrees with this comment and has made the suggested change.

Sec. 21.80(b) Trespass

The commentators felt that the reference to 18 Pa. C.S. Section 3503 is vague. There are three subsections in 18 Pa. C.S. Section 3503, each of which describes a different type of trespass and degree of offense. Clarification is needed as to the type of trespass and degree of offense referred to in Section 21.80(b).

The Department has clarified Section 21.80(b) by specifically referring to subsection (b) of 18 Pa. C.S. Section 3503 (relating to defiant trespasser).

Sec. 21.80 Trespass

The commentator objected to this section on the ground that it invites abuse of power.

The Department disagrees. Under the Conservation and Natural Resources Act, the Department has the power and duty to manage, control, protect and regulate the use of State Forest land. The Department, like any landowner, must have the ability to deal with unruly visitors who might cause property damage or who are interfering with the rights of others. The proposed section simply states that a person who engages in this behavior may be ordered by a State Forest officer to leave State Forest land. A person who refuses to leave when ordered commits criminal trespass under Section 3503(b) of the Pennsylvania Crimes Code. The language in the proposed Section 21.80 is identical to that in the Bureau of State Parks rules and regulations.

Simplification, clarification, elimination of redundancies

The following regulations were revised since proposed rulemaking to simplify or clarify their language or to eliminate redundancies. Most of these revisions were made in response to comments. No substantive changes were made to these regulations:

F. Benefits, Costs and Compliance

Benefits

The revisions to the State Forest regulations will provide for improved protection of the forest resource and to the public recreating on State Forest land. Therefore, all citizens will benefit from their adoption.

Compliance Costs

Visitors to State Forest land will be required to comply with the regulations governing conduct. However, there will be no cost to them arising from compliance. There will be a minimal cost to the Department in that it will be necessary to revise some existing signs and create a few new ones.

Compliance Assistance Plan

Not applicable.

Paperwork Requirements

There will be no increase in the amount of required paperwork.

G. Sunset Review

These regulations will be reviewed in accordance with the sunset review schedule published by the Department to determine whether the regulations effectively fulfill the goals for which they were intended.

H. Regulatory Review

Under section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act, the Act of June 30, 1989, (P.L. 73, No. 19), (71 P. S. §§ 745.1-745.15), the Department submitted a copy of the notice of proposed rulemaking, published at Volume 27 Pa. B. 4744 (September 13, 1997) on September 2, 1997 to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission and the Chairpersons of the Senate and House Environmental Resources and Energy Committees for review and comment. In compliance with Section 5(b.1), the Department also provided the Commission and the Committees with copies of all comments received, as well as other documentation.

In preparing this final-form regulation, the Department has considered all comments received from the Commission, the Committees and the public.

This final-form regulation was (deemed) approved by the House Environmental Resources and Energy Committee on _____ and was (deemed) approved by the Senate Environmental Resources and Energy Committee on _____. The Commission met on _____ and (deemed) approved the regulation in accordance with Section 5(c) of the Act.

I. Order of the Secretary

Acting under the authorizing statutes, I hereby order that:

- (1) The regulations of the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources, 17 Pennsylvania Code, Chapter 21, are amended by amending Chapter 21 to read as set forth in Annex A, with ellipses referring to the existing text of the regulations.
- (2) The Department shall submit this order and Annex A to the Office of General Counsel and the Office of Attorney General for approval and review as to legality and form, as required by law.

- (3) The Department shall submit this order and Annex A to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission and the Senate and House Environmental Resources and Energy Committees as required by the Regulatory Review Act.
- (4) The Department shall certify this order and Annex A and deposit them with the Legislative Reference Bureau as required by law.
- (5) This order shall take effect immediately.

TITLE 17. CONSERVATION AND NATURAL RESOURCES

PART I. DEPARTMENT OF CONSERVATION AND NATURAL RESOURCES

Subpart C. STATE FORESTS

CHAPTER 21. GENERAL PROVISIONS

PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS

§ 21.1. Definitions.

The following words and terms, when used in this chapter, have the following meanings, unless the context clearly indicates otherwise:

[Bureau—The Bureau of Forestry of the Department.]

Camping—Overnight lodging using standard camping equipment.

Commercial activity—An activity in which a person, organization or association directly or indirectly accepts consideration of value as compensation for the provision of goods or services, including transportation.

District Forester—The Department's Bureau of Forestry employee so designated.

Group activity—An organized activity occurring as a scheduled event and requiring a large land area or unique land formation and which may conflict with normal or traditional uses or pose a potential environmental problem.

Pack animal—A horse, mule, donkey or other heavy beast of burden.

State Forest designated hiking trail—Any trail on State Forest land which is listed as a major named hiking trail in the State Forest resource plan and posted as a State Forest designated hiking trail.

State Forest land—Land which is owned or leased by the Commonwealth and which is administered by the Bureau of Forestry.

§ 21.2. Scope.

This chapter applies to State [forests in the Commonwealth under the jurisdiction of the Department] Forest land.

§ 21.3. Violations.

(a) A person is guilty of a summary offense under 18 Pa.C.S. § 7505 (relating to violation of governmental rules regarding traffic) if that person commits an act which is prohibited by § 21.21 (relating to [licensed] motor vehicles).

* * * * *

§ 21.4. Closure.

(a) Areas or portions of a State Forest or State Forest facilities may be closed or restricted to certain uses by the District Forester or a designee.

(b) The public will be informed of the closed or restricted areas or facilities by any form of communication, which may include posted signs, or by fencing or other enclosure manifestly designed to exclude intruders.

(c) Violation of the closure or restriction notices under subsection (b) is prohibited.

BOATING

§ 21.11. Use.

[Unless posted otherwise, all] All waters on State Forest land [shall be] are open for the operation of watercraft unless posted as closed.
[Operation of watercraft in waters posted against] [such] [this] [operation] [shall be] [is] [prohibited.]

§ 21.12. Mooring and launching.

(a) Overnight mooring or storage of watercraft from November 15 through March 31 [shall be] is prohibited except on lands leased from the Commonwealth. This prohibition does not apply to canoes, kavaks, rafts and other paddle-powered small boats stored overnight at the operator's campsite.

(b) The launching or mooring of watercraft on waters [lakes and ponds] in State Forests requires the appropriate valid State Recreation Area Watercraft Permit affixed aft of amidship on the starboard-right-side.

* * * * *

(d) [Fees are as follows:

(1) Mooring Permit \$15/year

(2) Launching Permit \$5.00/year

(3) Boat Dock Permit \$5.00/year]

[Small, hand-carried boats, rafts and canoes may be launched from any point on the shoreline. Boats on trailers may be launched only at designated launch areas.] The Department will establish a schedule of fees for mooring and launching permits. This schedule and any subsequent revisions will be effective upon publication in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.

(e) [Boat launching shall be prohibited at other than designated launching areas.] Small, hand-carried boats, rafts and canoes may be launched from any point on the shoreline. Boats on trailers may be launched only at designated launch areas.

(f) [(e)] Boat mooring [shall be] is [prohibited at other than] restricted to designated mooring areas.

§ 21.13. Motorized boats.

[Use of motors, except electric motors, for the propulsion of watercraft] [shall be] [is] [prohibited.] Only electric motors may be used for propulsion of motorized watercraft.

MOTORIZED VEHICLES

§ 21.21. [Licensed motor] Motor vehicles.

(a) This section pertains to motor vehicles other than those addressed in §§ 21.22, 21.23 and 21.23a [and 21.23b] (relating to snowmobiles; all-terrain vehicles; and) trail bikes and other motorized off-road vehicles; and all-terrain vehicles).

(b) [Licensed motor vehicles shall be permitted on State Forest roads open to public travel.] Operation of motor vehicles on State Forest land in the following manners [shall be] is prohibited:

(1) Operation of [any] a motor vehicle in [a reckless or negligent manner,] careless disregard for the safety of persons or property, or in excess of posted speed limits or, where no speed limit is posted, in excess of 25 miles per hour.

(2) Driving on roads, trails or other areas not specifically designated and posted for motor vehicle traffic unless authorized in writing by the District Forester or a designee.

[(2)][(3)] Driving on roads, trails [,] [or] [other] [areas closed to] [vehicular traffic] [motor vehicles] [by posted signs or barriers.]

[(3)][(4)] The use of State Forest roads for commercial purposes without a Road Use Agreement from the Department. An individual or corporation whose property adjoins State Forest land is not required to obtain a Road Use Agreement to use State Forest roads for incidental commercial purposes to make deliveries to the property.

[(4)] Parking a vehicle in front of gates or on roads in such a manner as to interfere with the free use of the gate or the road.]

[(5)] (4) Operating unlicensed [or], unregistered or uninspected motor vehicles on State Forest [roads open to public travel] land.

§ 21.22. Snowmobiles.

(a) Snowmobiling [shall be] is permitted in accordance with 75 Pa.C.S. Chapter 77 (relating to snowmobiles) and this section.

(b) Snowmobiles may be operated only on designated snowmobile roads, designated trails[,] and designated and posted areas on State Forest land [from the day following the last day of] [regular or extended] [antlerless deer season as established by the Game Commission until the following April 1,] [inclusive,] [or earlier, as determined by] [snow conditions] [the District Forester].

(c) Snowmobiles may be operated on State Forest land from the day following the last day of regular or extended antlerless deer season as established by the Game Commission through the following April 1, or earlier, as determined by the District Forester.

[(c)] (d) Operation of snowmobiles on [any] a road, trail[,] or area not [specially] specifically designated and posted for snowmobile use or at any time of year [in which snowmobiling] [shall] [is] [not] [be] [permitted under this section] [shall be] other than that set forth in subsection (c) of this section is prohibited.

§ 21.23. Trail bikes[,] and other motorized off-road vehicles.

This section pertains to motorized off-road vehicles other than those addressed in §§ 21.22 and 21.23a (relating to snowmobiles; and all-terrain vehicles).

[(a)] (1) Trail bikes[,] and other motorized off-road vehicles [, and all other similar motorized recreation vehicles] may be operated only on [designated] roads, [designated] trails[,] or other areas [which] that have been specifically designated and posted for their use.

[(b)] (2) [Unless authorized in writing by the Bureau, all such vehicles are excluded from State Forest land between September 25 and the day following the last day of antlerless deer hunting season, inclusive, as established by the Game Commission.] Trail bikes and other motorized off-road vehicles may be operated only during the times of year authorized by the Department's Bureau of Forestry by posted signs.

[(c)] [(3)] [Operation of trail bikes] [, off-road vehicles,] [and] [all] [other] [similar] [motorized] [recreation] [off-road] [vehicles on any road, trail] [,] [or] [other] [area not] [specially] [specifically] [designated] [and posted] [for their use, or at any time of] [the] [year in which their use is excluded under this section] [shall be] [, is] [prohibited.]

§ 21.23a. All-terrain vehicles.

(a) The operation of all-terrain vehicles is permitted in accordance with 75 Pa.C.S. Chapter 77 (relating to all-terrain vehicles) and this section.

(b) All-terrain vehicles may be operated only on designated and posted roads, trails and other areas [from the Friday before Memorial Day until September 24, inclusive, and from the day following the last day of the regular or extended antlerless deer season as established by the Game Commission until April 1, inclusive].

(c) [Operation of all-terrain vehicles on a road, trail or area not specifically designated and posted for all-terrain vehicle use, or at any time of year in which all-terrain vehicle use is excluded under this section is prohibited.] All-terrain vehicles may be operated on State Forest land from the Friday before Memorial Day through the last full weekend in September, and from the day following the last day of the regular or extended antlerless deer season as established by the Game Commission through the following April 1.

§ 21.24. Spark arrestors.

[(a) All trail bikes, off-road vehicles, and other similar motorized recreation vehicles operating in, on, or through State Forest land shall have an approved, properly installed spark arrestor which shall meet and be qualified to either of the following:

(1) The United States Department of Agriculture, Forest Service Standard 5100-1a.

(2) The 80% efficiency level when determined in accordance with the appropriate SAE recommended practices J335 or J350 noise level restrictions.

(b) The United States Forest Service publication, *Spark Arrestor Guide*, will be used as the reference sources in determining whether or not a spark arrestor is approved.

(c) Operation of any trail bike, off-road vehicle, or other similar motorized recreation vehicle in, on, or through State Forest land without an approved spark arrestor shall be prohibited.]

Operation of any motorized vehicle, all-terrain vehicle, trail bike or other motorized off-road vehicle in, on or through State Forest land without a fully functional spark arrestor is prohibited.

§ 21.25. Parking

(a) Parking a motor vehicle, all-terrain vehicle, snowmobile, trail bike, other motorized off-road vehicle, boat trailer, camp trailer or other equipment which obstructs a gate, road, trail, footpath, bicycle path, access way, drinking fountain, entrance, exit or road turnaround on State Forest land is prohibited.

(b) No person shall park a vehicle in a parking area on State Forest land designated for handicapped persons, unless the vehicle bears a handicapped or severely disabled veteran registration plate or displays a handicapped or severely disabled veteran parking placard, in accordance with §1338 of the Vehicle Code, and the vehicle is operated by or for the transportation of a handicapped person or a severely disabled veteran.

[(b)](c) Violations of this section will be handled as follows:

(1) Prior to the filing of a citation charging a summary offense under this section, the Department may issue a parking ticket, which will be handed to the violator or placed on the windshield of the violator's vehicle. The violator may avoid criminal proceedings by paying a charge to the Department, equivalent to the maximum fine as provided in 18 Pa.C.S. § 7505 (relating to violation of governmental rules regarding traffic), within 5 days of the violation in the manner specified on the ticket.

(2) When a parking ticket has been issued, the Department may institute criminal proceedings only upon failure of the violator to pay the charge in accordance with the time limit specified in paragraph (1) and in the manner specified on the ticket.

(3) When a parking ticket has not been issued, the Department may institute criminal proceedings by issuing a citation.

[ANIMALS AND NONMOTORIZED VEHICLES]

§21.26. Horses and pack animals.

Horses and pack animals are permitted on State Forest land with the following exceptions:

(1) National and State Forest designated hiking trails unless posted as being open to their use.

(2) A road, trail or other area posted against the use of the animals.

§ 21.27. Bicycles and person-powered vehicles.

Bicycles and person-powered vehicles are permitted on State Forest land with the following exceptions:

(1) National and State Forest designated hiking trails unless posted as being open to their use.

(2) A road, trail or other area posted against the use of the vehicles.]

[FUEL WOOD]

FOREST PRODUCTS

§ 21.31. [Permit] Prohibitions.

[Cutting and removing any wood from State Forest land without a permit issued by the District Forester or his designee shall be prohibited.] The following activities are prohibited:

(1) Cutting, picking, digging, damaging or removing, in whole or in part, a living or dead plant, vine, shrub, tree or flower on State Forest land without written authorization of the District Forester or a designee, except that [berries, nuts, leeks and mushrooms] edible wild plants or plant parts may be gathered without authorization if they are gathered for one's own personal or family consumption. Dead and down wood for small campfires may be gathered without prior authorization.

(2) Removing rocks, shale, sand, clay, soil or other mineral products from State Forest land without written authorization of the District Forester or a designee.

(3) Removing peat, sawdust, bark, mulch or other products from State Forest land without written authorization of the District Forester or a designee.

(4) Removing or disturbing historical or archeological resources from State Forest land without written authorization of the District Forester or a designee.

(5) Planting a tree, shrub or plant of any kind without the written authorization of the District Forester or a designee.

§ 21.32. Designated trees.

[Cutting or removal of other than designated or marked trees] [shall be] ~~[is]~~[prohibited.] Only designated trees may be cut or removed.

§ 21.33. Cutting practices.

(a) The stump height of cut trees [shall] may not exceed the diameter of the stump or 12 inches whichever is smaller.

(b) All tops and slash shall be removed 25 feet from streams, roads, trails and State Forest boundaries.

(c) [The use of unauthorized cutting practices or the] The blocking of drainage ditches [along forest roads or streams], pipes and other structures with tops and slash [shall be] is prohibited.

§ 21.34. Removal.

[(a)] The removal of fuel wood and other forest products from the forest by [means] the use of tractors, skidders or any method other than hand carrying [shall be] is prohibited [unless otherwise authorized in writing by] without written authorization of the District Forester or a designee.

[(b) All wood of greater than 4-inch diameter from a felled tree must be removed.]

§ 21.35. [Liability] (Reserved).

[The Commonwealth will not be liable for any accidents, injuries or damages incurred by or caused by the permittee in cutting and removing fuel wood.]

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

§ 21.61. Camping permit.

[Camping is defined as overnight lodging using standard camping equipment.] Camping without a current camping permit issued by the District Forester or [his] a designee is prohibited; provided, however, that primitive backpack campers not using developed facilities shall not need a permit if they stay no more than one night at any campsite.

§ 21.62. Open fires.

(a) [Small fires for cooking or warming purposes shall be] Subject to the prohibition in subsection (b), small campfires are permitted only [at places] where adequate precautions are taken to prevent the spread of fire into the forest [, all]. All other fires are prohibited. Campfires shall be attended at all times.

(b) [All open] Open fires [of any kind shall be] are prohibited when the forest-fire danger is [posted as] determined by the District Forester to be High, Very High or Extreme and from March 1 through May 25 [inclusive] and from October 1 through December 1[, inclusive,] without authorization from the District Forester or a designee. This prohibition does not apply to small self-contained camp stoves when used in a safe manner.

(c) A person causing a wildfire, in addition to possible criminal penalty, [shall be] is liable for all damages, costs of extinction[,] and fines.

§ 21.63. Hunting and trapping.

[(a)] Hunting [shall be] and trapping on State Forest land are permitted in accordance with [current] the Pennsylvania [game laws] Game and Wildlife Code [on all areas] and rules and regulations, unless otherwise posted.

[(b) Hunting] [and trapping] [in violation of posted closure or special restriction notices] [shall be] [are] [prohibited.]

§ 21.64. Fishing.

[(a)] Fishing [shall be] in waters on State Forest land is permitted in accordance with [current] the Pennsylvania [fish] Fish and [boat] Boat [laws] Code and rules and regulations, unless otherwise posted.

[(b) Fishing in violation of posted closure or special restriction notices] [shall be] [is] [prohibited.]

§ 21.65. Target shooting.

Target shooting with firearms [or], bows and arrows [at other than protected and approved targets and in conformity with the Pennsylvania game laws shall be prohibited] or devices capable of launching projectiles and causing injury to persons or property is prohibited [at any location where it could cause or threaten injury, damage or disturbance to a person, animal, living tree, sign, structure or equipment] except where authorized by the District Forester or a designee.

§ 21.66. Destruction of property.

Damaging, defacing or removing any sign, structure, equipment or other material [shall be] is prohibited.

§ 21.67. Posting and soliciting.

Posting of signs or soliciting without [the permission of the Department] written authorization of the District Forester or a designee is prohibited.

§ 21.68. Littering and disposal.

Littering [of areas with] or disposal of garbage, paper, household refuse, waste or other [waste] material of any kind is prohibited.

§ 21.69. [Swimming] (Reserved).

[Unless otherwise authorized, swimming shall be prohibited in all dams, ponds, lakes and streams on State Forest lands.]

§ 21.70. [Removal of plants] (Reserved).

[Picking, digging, cutting, damaging or removing any living plant, vine, shrub or tree or flower thereof shall be prohibited unless authorized by written permit from the Department.]

§ 21.70a. Snow plowing.

The plowing or removal of snow from State Forest land without [written] authorization of the District Forester or a designee is prohibited.

§ 21.71. [Closure.] (Reserved).

[(a) Areas or portions of a State Forest or State Forest facilities may be closed] [or restricted] [to certain] [specified] [uses by the] [Department] [District Forester or a designee.]

[(b)] [Restricted areas or facilities will be conspicuously posted to inform the public of the restricted use of the area.] [The public will be informed of the closed or restricted areas or facilities by any form of communication, which may include posted signs, or by fencing or other enclosure manifestly designed to exclude intruders.]

[(c) Violation of the closure] [or restriction] [notices under subsection] [(a)] [(b)] [is prohibited.]

§ 21.72. Closure because of fire danger.

(a) [In the event] If the forest-fire danger rating is Very High or Extreme, [the Director of the Bureau may close] all or portions of the State Forest may be closed to certain specified uses.

* * * * *

§ 21.73. Pets.

Pets are permitted on State Forest land if they are kept under control and attended at all times.

§ 21.74. Disorderly conduct.

The following are prohibited:

- (1) Fighting [,] or other behavior that is threatening, violent or tumultuous [behavior] .
- (2) The possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages by persons under 21 years of age.
- (3) Creating an unreasonable noise that may disturb other visitors to State Forest land.

§ 21.75. Sanitation.

[The use of water outlets, springs, lakes or waterways for washing purposes, or the discharge of trailer, camper or motor home sewage, sink water or bath water on or into the ground or surface waters, is prohibited.]

(a) Washing in water outlets, springs, lakes or waterways is prohibited.

(b) Discharging of trailer, camper or motor home sewage, sink water or bath water on or into ground or surface waters is prohibited.

§ 21.76. Feeding of wildlife.

(a) Feeding of wildlife, except for elevated songbird feeders of less than one-half bushel capacity, is prohibited on State Forest land from 30 days prior to the beginning of spring gobbler season [until the day following the last day] through the end of flintlock muzzleloader deer season.

(b) Placing of wildlife feeders of more than one-half bushel combined capacity on State Forest land without the authorization of the District Forester or a designee, is prohibited.

§ 21.77. Commercial activity.

Selling, distributing, delivering, servicing, guiding or renting any equipment, material or commodity or otherwise engaging in commercial activity on State Forest land without written authorization of the District Forester or a designee is prohibited.

§ 21.78. Group activities.

Group activities are prohibited without written authorization of the District Forester or a designee.

§ 21.79. Structures.

Building or erecting a structure or memorial, or engaging in construction or excavation activity, without written authorization of the Department is prohibited.

§ 21.80. Trespass.

(a) A person who violates this chapter or disregards instructions or warnings given by a State Forest officer or interferes with a State Forest officer in the performance of the duties of the officer may be ordered to leave State Forest land.

(b) A person who refuses to leave State Forest land, after receiving an order to leave from a State Forest officer, commits an act of criminal trespass under subsection (b) of 18 Pa.C.S. § 3503 (relating to [criminal] defiant trespasser).

**Proposed Rulemaking - State Forests
17 Pa Code Chapter 21**

Comments and Responses

Sec. 21.1 Definitions

Comment: The commentator suggested revising the definition of commercial activity to read, "An activity in which a person, organization or association directly or indirectly" (*Commentator 660*)

Response: The Department agrees with this suggestion and has changed the wording accordingly.

Sec. 21.1 Definitions

Comment: The commentators stated that the definition of Group Activity is unclear and ask if group activities include groups of hunters, hikers, etc. (*Commentators 22, 28, 632, 651, 850, and 1095*)

Response: For an activity to fall under the definition of "group activity," three criteria must be met. It must be a scheduled event. It must require a large land area or unique land formation, AND it must have the potential to conflict with traditional uses of State Forest land or pose a potential threat to the environment.

Sec. 21.1 Definitions

Comment: It was suggested that the word "heavy" be deleted from the definition of pack animal. (*Commentator 660*)

Response: The Department did not make the suggested change. Eliminating the word heavy would preclude the use of llamas and dogs with "doggie packs."

Sec. 21.11 Use

Comment: The language of Section 21.11 is complicated and redundant. Commentator suggested "All waters on State Forest land are open for the operation of watercraft unless posted as closed." (*Commentator 1095*)

Response: The Department agrees and has changed the wording accordingly.

Sec. 21.12(a) Mooring and Launching

Comment: Section 21.12(a) appears to prohibit canoe camping after November 15 and before March 31. The commentator suggested the following language: "Overnight mooring or storage of watercraft, except canoes, kayaks, rafts and other paddle-powered small boats stored overnight at the operator's campsite from November 15 through March 31 is prohibited except on lands leased from the Commonwealth." (*Commentator 660*)

Response: It is not the Department's intent to prohibit such camping during those months. Therefore, the wording of this section has been modified.

Sec. 21.12(b) Mooring and Launching

Comment: Section 21.12(b), in its proposed form, would not include rivers and streams flowing through State Forest land. The commentator suggested revising the language to include rivers and streams. (*Commentator 1095*)

Response: The Department agrees. The original word, "waters," has been retained so that it includes all bodies of water on State Forest land.

Sec. 21.12(b) Mooring and Launching

Comment: Section 21.12(b) should be reworded to make it clear that boats may be launched without a State Recreation Area Watercraft Permit so long as a valid registration issued by the Fish and Boat Commission is affixed to the boat. (*Commentators 5 and 6*)

Response: Subsection (c) of Section 21.12 in the current rules and regulations states, "A current Fish and Boat Commission number and certificate of watercraft registration permits daily launching only." This section will remain unchanged in the final rulemaking, as indicated by the ellipsis after Subsection (b) in the proposed rulemaking.

Sec. 21.12(d) (subsection (e) in final rulemaking) Mooring and Launching

Comment: Allowing the launching of small boats, rafts and canoes from any point on the shoreline will cause erosion of banks. (*Commentator 7*)

Response: The suggested change has not been made. The Department is of the opinion that any environmental degradation will be negligible. If such

damage should become evident, that particular point on the shoreline will be posted prohibiting the launching of watercraft.

Sec. 21.12(d) (subsection (e) in final rulemaking) Mooring and Launching

Comment: The commentator suggested adding wording to Section 21.12(d) (subsection (e) in final rulemaking) to prohibit launching of boats from private docks without the owner's permission. (*Commentator 642*)

Response: The Department has not added the suggested provision. The Department does not have the duty or power to enforce private property rights.

Sec. 21.12(e) (subsection (f) in final rulemaking) Mooring and Launching

Comment: Commentator stated that the language in this section is unnecessarily complicated. Commentator suggested, "Boat mooring is restricted to designated mooring areas." (*Commentator 1095*)

Response: The Department agrees and has adopted the suggested wording.

Sec. 21.13 Motorized Boats

Comment: The language in this section is unnecessarily complicated. (*Commentator 1095*)

Response: The Department agrees and has revised the wording accordingly. ("Only electric motors may be used for propulsion of motorized watercraft.")

Sec. 21.21(a) Motor Vehicles

Comment: Section 21.21(a) references sections 21.22, 21.23a and 21.23b. However, Section 21.23b does not exist due to section redesignations. (*Commentator 1095*)

Response: The commentator is correct. The reference to Section 21.23b has been replaced with a reference to Section 21.23.

Sec. 21.21(b)(2) Motor Vehicles

Comment: The commentator stated that it would be better to post roads as being closed in Section 21.21(b)(2). (*Commentator 10*)

Response: The suggested change has not been made. Most of the Bureau of Forestry's roads that are open to vehicles are already posted as being open. Those that are not will be posted prior to the regulations being adopted. The Department believes that this section will make enforcement much more efficient and will cause the Department's rules and regulations to be identical to the Pennsylvania Game Commission's thereby reducing confusion among visitors to both agencies' lands.

Sec. 21.21(b)(3) Motor Vehicles

Comment: Commentator suggested deleting 21.21(b)(3) since it simply restates the provisions of Section 21.71. (*Commentator 1095*)

Response: The Department agrees. Section 21.21(b)(3) has been deleted.

Sec. 21.22(b) Snowmobiles

Comment: This provision lacks clarity because both the location and the season are in the same sentence. Commentator suggested splitting the proposed provisions into separate subsections or sentences. Commentator also suggests adding the word "only" to the provision concerning location, as follows: "Snowmobiles may be operated only on designated snowmobile roads" (*Commentator 1095*)

Response: The Department agrees with the comment and has adopted the suggested wording and placed the provision in different subsections.

Sec. 21.23(3) Trail Bikes

Comment: Paragraph (3) restates the provisions of paragraphs (1) and (2). Therefore it is redundant. (*Commentator 1095*)

Response: The Department agrees. Paragraph (3) has been eliminated.

Sec. 21.23a(b) All-Terrain Vehicles

Comment: Commentator suggested adding the word “only” to the provision concerning location, as follows: “All-terrain vehicles may be operated only on designated and posted roads” (*Commentator 1095*)

Response: The Department agrees with the comment and has adopted the suggested wording. For purposes of clarity, it has also split this provision into a subsection concerning location and a subsection concerning season.

Sec. 21.23a(b) All-Terrain Vehicles

Comment: Section 21.23a(b) should be changed so that ATV’s may be operated through the last full weekend in September rather than until September 24. (*Commentator 1*)

Response: The Department agrees with this comment and has changed Section 21.23a (b) accordingly.

Sec. 21.23a All-Terrain Vehicles

Comment: The commentators proposed banning ATV’s from State Forest land. (*Commentators 3, 4, 12*)

Response: The Department feels that ATV’s are a legitimate recreational pursuit. Therefore, the Department did not make the suggested change . Section 21.23a addresses the use of ATV’s and restricts them to those trails and areas that have been specifically designated for their use.

Sec. 21.25(b)(1) Parking

Comment: The commentator suggested that a higher fine for parking violations be included in Section 21.25(b)(1). (*Commentators 7 and 182*)

Response: The Department did not make the suggested change because the fine is governed by 18 Pa. C.S. Section 7505 which permits a maximum fine of \$5.00.

Sec. 21.25 Parking

Comment: The commentator requested that wording be added to Section 21.25 that would prohibit an able-bodied vehicle operator from parking in designated handicapped parking areas. (*Commentator 23*)

Response: The Department agrees with this suggestion. New language has been added accordingly.

Sec. 21.25 Parking

Comment: The commentator felt that Section 21.25 will severely limit parking on State Forest land. (*Commentator 10*)

Response: The Department does not believe this is the case and no change has been made. Section 21.25 (a) prohibits only parking that hinders the use of the resource by other visitors. This wording mirrors that in the Bureau of State Parks rules and regulations.

Sec. 21.25 Parking

Comment: The commentator suggested adding a subsection to Section 21.25 that would allow a State Forest Officer to have an illegally parked vehicle towed away. (*Commentator 651*)

Response: The Department did not make the suggested change. State Forest Officers do not have "police powers" in the traditional sense. Therefore, the police agency that has jurisdiction on State Forest land is the Pennsylvania State Police. If and when certain State Forest Officers are commissioned to have full police powers under the Crimes Code, they will automatically have the authority to have vehicles towed.

Section 21.26(1) Horses and Pack Animals

Section 21.27(1) Bicycles and Person-Powered Vehicles

Comment: Many commentators expressed concern with the provisions prohibiting use of horses, pack animals, bicycles and person-powered vehicles on National and State Forest Designated Hiking Trails unless posted as being open to their use. They felt that these provisions unreasonably favor one recreational use (hiking) to the disadvantage of other uses. (*Commentators 13, 14, 16, 18, 19-21, 25, 27, 29-41, 43-98, 100-103, 105, 106, 108-114, 116-132, 138, 140-143, 151-155, 159, 164, 165, 167, 171, 175, 176, 187-*

275, 278, 280, 283, 285, 288, 297, 303-423, 425-627, 629, 630, 632, 633, 638, 641, 647, 653-655, 661, 662, 664, 667-848, 850, 854, 866, 868, 870, 871, 873, 875, 876, 879, 895, 898, 912, 914, 917-923, 931, 933, 934, 938, 948-1042, 1044, 1047, 1051, 1053, 1056, 1057, 1060, 1062, 1068-1075, 1077-1079, 1084, 1087, 1088, 1090, 1092, 1093 and 1095)

Many other commentators supported the provisions, claiming that these other uses, particularly horseback riding, damage trails meant for hiking. (*Commentators 6, 24, 139, 156-158, 161-163, 166, 168-170, 172-174, 177, 182, 184-186, 276, 277, 281, 282, 284, 289-296, 298-302, 628, 631, 634-637, 639, 640, 643, 644, 648, 649, 651, 652, 656-659, 663, 665, 666, 849, 851-853, 855, 856-865, 867, 869, 872, 874, 877, 878, 880, 882-886, 888-894, 896, 897, 899, 901-911, 913, 916, 924-927, 928-930, 932, 935-937, 939-947, 1043, 1045, 1046, 1049, 1050, 1052, 1054, 1055, 1061, 1063, 1065-1067, 1076, 1080, 1082, 1083, 1086, 1089, 1091 and 1094*)

Response: There are two National Hiking Trails and 18 State Forest Designated Hiking Trails in the Commonwealth. The proposed regulations would impose the assumption that these trails would be closed for horses, pack animals, bicycles and person-powered vehicles unless posted as being open. In view of the intense controversy and confusion generated by these proposed regulations, the Department is deleting them from the proposed rulemaking. The Department intends to revisit these issues and will redraft these regulations regarding the use of horses and mountain bikes on State Forest land in consultation with a work group to be made up of interested stakeholders. Meanwhile, the Department retains its authority under Section 21.71 to post trails and other areas as being closed to certain uses.

21.31(1) Prohibitions

Comment: Section 21.31 (1) prohibits, among other things, the damaging of dead plants without the written authorization of the District Forester. The commentator asked if this section would prohibit having a small campfire made from dead and down wood gathered from the forest floor. (*Commentator 6*)

Response: The commentator has a valid point. Therefore, wording has been added to Section 21.31(1) allowing dead wood to be gathered for a small campfire.

Sec. 21.31 Prohibitions

Comment: Section 21.31 should include a prohibition of timber harvesting during songbird nesting seasons. (*Commentator 28*)

Response: The Department did not make the suggested change. The State Forest Rules and Regulations are designed to govern the conduct of visitors to State Forest land while timber harvesting is controlled by Department policy and coordinated by the Central Office.

Sec. 21.31(1) Prohibitions

Comment: The commentators suggested including a prohibition of planting exotic, invasive plant species. Further, one of the commentators suggested that paragraph (1) be changed by deleting the words, “berries, nuts, leeks and mushrooms” and substituting the words “edible wild plants or plant parts . . .” (*Commentators 42 and 1095*)

Response: The Department agrees with these comments and has made the suggested revisions.

Sec. 21.31 Prohibitions

Comment: The commentators suggested adding a subsection to Section 21.31 that would allow gold prospecting in streams on State Forest land by dredging or the sluice box and shovel method. (*Commentators 645, 1058, 1081, 1085*)

Response: The Department did not make the suggested revision. Department policy now restricts recreational gold prospecting to “hand panning” under certain circumstances as addressed in the response to the comment below. Any other method of gold prospecting is at least temporarily destructive to the environment.

Sec. 21.31 Prohibitions

Comment: The commentator suggested “hand panning” be the only method approved for gold prospecting in streams on State Forest land. He contends that other methods such as dredging and the sluice box and shovel method can be destructive. (*Commentator 26*)

Response: The concerns of this commentator are already addressed by Department policy which states as follows: "Recreational, noncommercial hand panning for placer gold or other minerals is permitted in the rivers and streams of State Forest lands except in Wild and Natural Areas and in waters classified as 'Exceptional Value' or 'High Quality.' Any other activity relating to mineral exploration that disturbs the channel bottom, banks, riparian zone or flood plain is prohibited."

Sec. 21.32 Designated Trees

Comment: Language is complicated. It is suggested that it be changed to "Only designated trees may be cut or removed." (*Commentator 1095*)

Response: The Department agrees. The suggested change has been made.

Sec. 21.33 Cutting Practices

Comment: The commentator suggested that acreage available for timber harvesting should be included under Section 21.33. (*Commentator 28*)

Response: The Department did not make the suggested change. Timber sales on State Forest land are tightly controlled by Department policy and the State Forest Resource Plan.

Sec. 21.34 Removal

Comment: The commentator suggested adding a set of criteria after Section 21.34 for the processing of requests to conduct research on State Forest land. (*Commentator 28*)

Response: The Department did not make the suggested change. Research on State Forest land is already controlled by a set of criteria in the form of policy. All research requests are reviewed extensively before permission to conduct research is given.

Sec. 21.61 Camping Permit

Comment: The first sentence of this section provides a definition of "camping." It should be moved to Section 21.1 *Definitions*. (*Commentator 1095*)

Response: The Department agrees. The definition has been moved to Section 21.1.

Sec. 21.61 Camping Permit

Comment: The commentator asked if Section 21.61 would preclude someone from sleeping overnight in their vehicle if they were not using “standard camping equipment.” (*Commentator 2*)

Response: Section 21.61 would not prohibit someone from sleeping in their vehicle either overnight or during daylight hours.

Sec. 21.61 Camping Permit

Comment: The commentators objected to Section 21.61 in requiring primitive backpack campers to obtain a camping permit on the grounds that it is overly restrictive and often difficult to conveniently obtain a permit with short notice.. (*Commentators 6, 10, 11, 12, 113, 133, 145, 155, 183, 423, 632, 651, 660, 850, 871, 1051, 1054, 1059, 1076 and 1095*)

Response: The Department will retain the existing wording in this section so that backpackers may camp without first obtaining a camping permit.

Sec. 21.61 Camping Permit

Comment: The commentator objected to the Department allowing “motorized camping” and suggests that no camping permits be issued to campers who use their vehicles as an integral part of the camping experience. (*Commentator 660*)

Response: The Department’s Forest Recreation Committee is presently examining this issue along with other recreation issues. It would be premature at this time to impose a prohibition against this type of camping.

Sec. 21.62 Open fires

Comment: The commentators suggested adding a provision at the end of Section 21.62 to the effect that this restriction does not apply to small self-contained camp stoves when being used in a safe manner. (*Commentators 115, 1059 and 1095*)

Response: The Department agrees with this suggestion and has added the wording.

Sec. 21.62 Open Fires

Comment: The commentators objected to Section 21.62(b) prohibiting open fires from March 1 to May 25 and from October 1 to December 1 without authorization from the District Forester. (*Commentators 183, 651, 660 and 1054*)

Response: The Department did not make the suggested change. The spring and fall months are the highest fire danger months of the year. The Bureau of Forestry's field staff has been pointing out the need for this prohibition for many years. The District Forester's authorization for an open fire during these months is easy to obtain. A phone call to a forest district office is all that is necessary since the authorization need not be in writing.

Sec. 21.63 Hunting and Trapping

Comment: The commentator suggested replacing the general reference to the Pennsylvania game laws with a specific reference to the Game and Wildlife Code. (*Commentator 855*)

Response: Since the suggested wording is more accurate, the Department has made the change.

Sec. 21.63(b) Hunting and Trapping

Comment: Subsection (b) is redundant and unnecessary. (*Commentator 1095*)

Response: The Department agrees. Subsection (b) has been eliminated.

Sec. 21.64(b) Fishing

Comment: Subsection (b) is redundant and unnecessary. (*Commentator 1095*)

Response: The Department agrees. Subsection (b) has been eliminated.

Sec. 21.65 Target Shooting

Comment: Since most of the commentators felt this section would allow target shooting virtually anywhere on State Forest land the wording in Section 21.65 is apparently subject to too broad an interpretation. (*Commentators*

10, 99, 104, 107, 133, 136, 137, 144, 160, 286, 287, 881, 887, 927, 1064 and 1095)

Response: The Department has changed this section to prohibit target shooting except where authorized by the District Forester.

Sec. 21.69 Swimming

Comment: The deletion of Section 21.69 prohibiting swimming in waters on State Forest land will lead to environmental damage. (*Commentator 7*)

Response: The Department has not re-inserted 21.69. Waters in which it would be inappropriate to swim from a safety or environmental point of view will be posted as such thereby prohibiting swimming.

Sec. 21.70a Snow Plowing

Comment: The commentators felt that Section 21.70a which prohibits snow plowing on State Forest roads without the approval of the District Forester may lead to denying access to property owners. (*Commentators 10, 145, 155, 423, 632, 871*)

Response: The suggested change has not been made. The Department does not intend to deny access to any person with a legitimate need. However, it is important that the Department has control over how State Forest roads are plowed. Plowing snow from crowned earthen roads will lead to serious road damage if not done properly. Moreover, many of the State Forest roads are also part of the snowmobile system. It is important that roads be plowed in such a way that this sport is not adversely impacted. However, the wording of the section has been modified so that the District Forester's verbal authorization is sufficient.

Sec. 21.71 Closure

Comment: The commentator suggested that since many provisions of this chapter refer to closure of portions of State Forest land for certain activities or times of year, additional emphasis be placed on this section by moving it to a more prominent location under PRELIMINARY PROVISIONS. (*Commentator 1095*)

Response: The Department agrees. This section has been relocated and re-numbered as Section 21.4.

Sec. 21.71(a) Closure

Comment: The commentator objected to Section 21.71(a) which gives District Foresters the authority to close areas of State Forest land to certain uses without having a monitoring system in place to insure that this authority is not abused. (*Commentator 6*)

Response: The Department made no change to this section. By policy, a monitoring system is already in place.

Sec. 21.74 Disorderly Conduct

Comment: Paragraph (2) of Section 21.74 should be changed to prohibit the possession of alcoholic beverages except within leased campsite buildings. (*Commentator 15*)

Response: The Department did not make the suggested change. The legal use of alcohol on State Forest land has seldom been a problem. Most Federal agencies do not prohibit alcohol. Neither does the Game Commission. Alcohol is prohibited from State Forest Picnic Areas by the rules and regulations for those areas.

Sec. 21.74 Disorderly Conduct

Comment: The commentators suggested that a provision be added prohibiting loud noise that might disturb other visitors to State Forest land. (*Commentators 2 and 1095*)

Response: The Department agrees with this comment and has added Paragraph (3) to Section 21.74.

Sec. 21.75 Sanitation

Comment: The commentators suggested that this section is too confusing and too restrictive in its proposed form. (*Commentators 42, 651 and 1095*)

Response: The Department agrees with this comment and has re-written the section accordingly.

Sec. 21.76(a) Feeding of Wildlife

Comment: Section 21.76 (a) should be changed to allow the summer feeding of wildlife. (*Commentators 4, 8, 424 and 646*)

Response: The Department did not make the suggested change. Comments from the Pennsylvania Game Commission, including one from that agency's chief game biologist, state that artificial feeding of wildlife is unnecessary and may actually harm wildlife.

Sec. 21.76 Feeding of Wildlife

Comment: The commentators suggested prohibiting artificial feeding of wildlife, except for songbirds. The commentators felt that artificial feeding of wildlife is unnecessary and possibly harmful to wildlife. (*Commentators 424, 650, 855*)

Response: The Department did not make this change. Although the Pennsylvania Game Commission discourages artificial feeding of wildlife, many sportsmen have a tradition of feeding wildlife, especially in the winter months. An outright prohibition of this activity would outrage a large number of people. Instead, with the Game Commission's assistance, the Department will attempt to educate the public concerning the detrimental aspects of artificial feeding.

Sec. 21.76(a) Feeding of Wildlife

Comment: The wording in this section is confusing. It should be simplified. (*Commentator 1095*)

Response: The Department agrees. The wording has been simplified.

Sec. 21.76(b) Feeding of Wildlife

Comment: The commentator suggested that the prohibition be against placing of feeders that have a single or combined capacity of more than one-half bushel. (*Commentator 26*)

Response: The Department agrees with this comment and has made the suggested change.

Sec. 21.77 Commercial Activity

- Comment:** The commentator suggested that guidelines be included in Section 21.77 concerning how and to whom authorization will be issued. (*Commentator 660*)
- Response:** The Department did not make this change because guidelines should not be a part of the regulatory process. However, the Department's Forest Recreation Committee is in the process of developing guidelines that will be distributed to all District Foresters.

Sec. 21.80(b) Trespass

- Comment:** The reference to 18 Pa. C.S. Section 3503 is vague. There are three subsections in 18 Pa. C.S. Section 3503, each of which describes a different type of trespass and degree of offense. Clarification is needed as to the type of trespass and degree of offense referred to in Section 21.80(b). (*Commentators 9 and 1095*)
- Response:** The Department has clarified Section 21.80(b) by specifically referring to subsection (b) of 18 Pa. C.S. Section 3503 (relating to defiant trespasser).
-

Sec. 21.80 Trespass

- Comment:** The commentator objected to this section on the ground that it invites abuse of power. (*Commentator 915*)
- Response:** The Department disagrees. Under the Conservation and Natural Resources Act, the Department has the power and duty to manage, control, protect and regulate the use of State Forest land. The Department, like any landowner, must have the ability to deal with unruly visitors who might cause property damage or who are interfering with the rights of others. The proposed section simply states that a person who engages in this behavior may be ordered by a State Forest officer to leave State Forest land. A person who refuses to leave when ordered commits criminal trespass under Section 3503(b) of the Pennsylvania Crimes Code. The language in the proposed Section 21.80 is identical to that in the Bureau of State Parks rules and regulations.
