I am writing to offer my support for the comments submitted by the Pennsylvania Builders Association regarding the above referenced regulation. I know this regulation is scheduled for consideration by IRRC on November 4, 1999, and apologize for the delay in submitting my comments.

I am most concerned regarding the proposed requirement for a written erosion and sediment control plan for any earthmoving activity of 5000 square feet or greater. It is my understanding that such a requirement exceeds federal regulatory requirements. There should be a clearly articulated and compelling reason for Pennsylvania to exceed these regulations, particularly if we are to adhere to Governor Ridge's Executive Order on this matter.

Additionally, such a requirement creates a potentially burdensome and expensive requirement on citizens seeking to build a new home. As policymakers, it is important to be cognizant of the cumulative affects requirements can have on citizens.
