On October 27, IRRC requested information on the estimated time and cost associated with the development of an Erosion and Sediment Control Plan for earth disturbance projects between 5,000 square feet and one acre. In follow-up to their request, Division staff have determined that the relative cost for these small project plans ranges from \$100 to \$500. Costs up to \$2,000 were determined when plans are developed to meet municipal ordinances that are more stringent than Chapter 102. The time needed to prepare a plan of this type ranged from a few hours to one day, depending on the complexity of the site (slope of site, location to receiving water, etc.). In addition, I will provide you with examples of "small project" plans developed by the Southeast Pennsylvania Conservation Districts, Coastal Environmental Services, and the Georgia Department of Natural Resources that could be used by landowners, contractors or others at little or no cost.
