PROPOSAL: Regulation 16A-548 amends 49 PA Code, Chapter 27, regulations of the StatBush
Board of Pharmacy. The amendment makes revisions to the sabed 12.62 increasing fees for providing certain services, and in two instances, reducing the fees.

The proposed Rulemaking was published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin on February 27, 1999. Jewett The Professional Licensure Committee has until April 19, 1999, to submit comments on the regulation.

ANALYSIS: Pursuant to Sec. 8.2 of the Pharmacy Act, 63 P.S. Sec. 390-8.2, the Board is required to meet expenditures through revenues raised by fees, fines and civil penalties. The Board states that a recent systems audit determined that the fees for certain services did not accurately reflect the actual cost involved in providing the service. Accordingly, the Board proposes to amend the schedule of fees as follows:
