Yes. The Board is required by statute to adopt regulations setting fees. See Item No. 9 for the specific law.

(11) Explain the compelling public interest that justifies the regulation. What is the problem it addresses?

The regulation is necessary to insure that the candidates' fees cover the cost of the examinations and to comply with Section 812.1 of the Administrative Code of 1929, 71 P.S. §279.3a.

(12) State the public health, safety, environmental or general welfare risks associated with nonregulation.

If the examination fees are not established by regulation, the Board will not be in compliance with the law and prospective psychologists will be unable to obtain licensure in the most cost-effective manner.

(13) Describe who will benefit from the regulation. (Quantify the benefits as completely as possible and approximate the number of people who will benefit.)

The licensing population generally will benefit by having cost of services which are utilized by only a portion of the licensees paid by those users.

(14) Describe who will be adversely affected by the regulation. (Quantify the adverse effects as completely as possible and approximate the number of people who will be adversely affected.)

The regulation will create no adverse effects on any person or group of persons. In fact, all will benefit. See paragraphs 12 and 13.

(15) List the persons, groups or entities that will be required to comply with the regulation. (Approximate the number of people who will be required to comply.)

Candidates for licensure by examination will be required to comply with the regulation in order to sit for the licensure examination. The Board estimates that approximately 100 persons will apply to take the examination in the Commonwealth each fiscal year.

(16) Describe the communications with and input from the public in the development and drafting of the regulation. List the persons and/or groups who were involved, if applicable.

The Board has not communicated with or received input from regulated interests in the development and drafting of this regulation because the fees represent the actual contractual rate for the professional testing agency to develop, administer and grade the licensure examination. Under these circumstances, public comment is unnecessary. All persons affected by the fee increase, however, will be given actual notice of the Board's intention to amend the regulation in advance of final rulemaking pursuant to Section 204(2) of the Commonwealth Documents Law, 45 P.S. §1204(2).

(17) Provide a specific estimate of the costs and/or savings to the regulated community associated with compliance, including any legal, accounting or consulting procedures which may be required.

Candidates for licensure will be required to pay \$395.00 for the national portion of the examination (\$350.00 examination cost plus \$45.00 administration fee). This cost represents the increase in the examination fee as a result of the contract with Professional Examination Services (PES). Except for the candidates for licensure, the regulated community will experience no costs or savings associated with this regulation. The cost for the state portion is unchanged.

(18) Provide a specific estimate of the costs and/or savings to local governments associated with compliance, including any legal, accounting or consulting procedures which may be required.

Local governments would not be affected by the regulation.

NOTICE OF FINAL/PROPOSED OMITTED RULEMAKING COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA DEPARTMENT OF STATE BUREAU OF PROFESSIONAL AND OCCUPATIONAL AFFAIRS STATE BOARD OF PSYCHOLOGY 49 Pa. Code, Chapter 41 Examination Fees By this Order, the State Board of Psychology amends 49 Pa. Code, Chapter 41, pertaining to increased fees for the national portion of the April 1999 and subsequent examinations for licensure as set forth in the following annex.

Under Section 812.1 of the Administrative Code of 1929, Act of April 9, 1929, P.L. 177, added by the Act of October 8, 1980, P.L. 785, <u>as amended</u>, 71 P.S. §279.3a, examinations for licensure must be prepared and administered by a professional testing organization under contract to the appropriate board. Both the national portion (Pennsylvania Practice of Psychology Examination) and the state portion (Pennsylvania Psychology Law Examinations) are administered by Professional Examination Service.

These amendments will change fees for the national portion of the examination to candidates for licensure. Contract costs for the national portion of the examination will increase from \$295 to \$350 per candidate beginning April 1999. In order to identify the source of the increase, the contract costs for each portion of the examination are segregated from the administrative costs. Therefore, while the Annex alters the fees for the national and state portions of the examination as well as the administrative costs, only the fees for the national portion will be increased.

Public notice of intention to amend the regulations pursuant to the procedures specified in Sections 201 and 202 of the Act of July 31, 1968, P.L. 769, 45 P.S. §§1201-1202 (commonly referred to as the "Commonwealth Documents Law"), has been omitted as authorized pursuant to Section 204(3) of the Commonwealth Documents 45 P.S. §1204(3), because the Board finds that these Law, procedures are, under the circumstances, unnecessary. Public comment is unnecessary because Section 812.1 of the Administrative requires that candidate fees cover the cost of the Code examination. All persons affected by the amendments, however, have been or will be given actual notice of the Board's intention to amend the regulations in advance of final rulemaking pursuant to Section 204(2) of the Commonwealth Documents Law, 45 P.S. §1204(2).

STATUTORY AUTHORITY

These amendments are adopted under the authority of Section

812.1 of the Administrative Code of 1929, Act of April 9, 1929, P.L. 177, <u>as amended</u>, 71 P.S. §279.3a, and Sections 3.2(2) and 3.3(d) of the Professional Psychologists Practice Act (63 P.S. §§1203.2(2) and 1203.3(d)).

FISCAL IMPACT AND PAPERWORK REQUIREMENTS

The amendments will have no fiscal impact on the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. Candidates for licensure by examination will be required to pay an increased fee to cover contract costs for the national portion of the examination.

REGULATORY REVIEW

Pursuant to Section 5.1(c) of the Regulatory Review Act, Act of June 30, 1989, (P.L. 73, No. 19) (71 P.S. §§745.1-745.15), a copy of the amendment was submitted on <u>March 19,1999</u> to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) and the Chairmen of the Senate Committee on Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure and the House Committee on Professional Licensure. In addition, at the same time, the amendments were submitted to the Attorney General for review and comment pursuant to the Commonwealth Attorneys Act.

Under Section 5(e) of the Regulatory Review Act, the amendment was (deemed) approved by the Senate Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure Committee on ______ and (deemed) approved by the House Professional Licensure Committee on ______. IRRC met on ______ and approved the regulation.
