The regulation amends the fee schedule for the State Board of Nursing by revising fees for licensure by endorsement, applications for out of state graduates, restoration after sanction, reactivation of licenses, temporary practice permits, extension of temporary practice permits, CRNP certifications, applications for approval of new nursing programs, review and challenge of RN and PN examinations, certification of scores and certification of license history. The new fees are needed because the current fees established in 1987, 1991, and 1993 no longer reflect the cost of providing the enumerated services.

(9) State the statutory authority for the regulation and any relevant state or federal court decisions.

The regulatory amendments are adopted under sections 11.2(a) and (d) of the Professional Nursing Law, Act of May 22, 1951, P.L. 317, <u>as amended</u>, 63 P.S. §§221.2(a) and (d) and under section 17.5(a) of the Practical Nurse Law, Act of March 2, 1956, P.L. (1995) 1211, <u>as amended</u>, 63 P.S. §667.5(a).

(10) Is the regulation mandated by any federal or state law or court order, or federal regulation? If yes, cite the specific law, case or regulation, and any deadlines for action.

Yes. The Board is required by statute to adopt regulations setting fees. See Item No. 9 for the specific law.

(11) Explain the compelling public interest that justifies the regulation. What is the problem it addresses?

The enabling statute of the Board requires that the Board set fees by regulation so that revenues meet or exceed expenditures over a biennial period. The operating expenses of the Board are generally borne by the licensee population through biennial renewal revenue. Expenses related to services which are provided directly to individual licensees or applicants are excluded from general operating revenues so that only the licensee who uses a particular service pays for a service being provided to him or her. By this regulation, the cost of providing the service will be apportioned to users, rather than burdening the entire licensee population.

(12) State the public health, safety, environmental or general welfare risks associated with nonregulation.

Nonregulation could potentially adversely impact fiscal integrity of the Board. If left unregulated, the costs of providing services would be borne by the general licensing population, some of whom did not or would not receive a benefit from the service.

(13) Describe who will benefit from the regulation. (Quantify the benefits as completely as possible and approximate the number of people who will benefit.)

The licensing population generally will benefit by having costs of services which are utilized by only a portion of the licensees or applicants paid by those actually receiving the service.

The Board has identified no group of individuals or entities who will be adversely affected by the regulation. Applicants for services or licenses will be required to bear up-to-date costs of providing the services involved.

(15) List the persons, groups or entities that will be required to comply with the regulation. (Approximate the number of people who will be required to comply.)

Applicants for licensure by endorsement, out-of-state graduates applying to take the RN or PN examination, licensees applying for restoration after sanction, applicants for license reactivation, applicants for temporary permits and extended temporary permits, applicants for CRNP certification, applicants for approval of new nursing education programs, applicants who request a review and challenge of the RN and PN examination, and those who request certification of scores and certification of license history will be required to pay the applicable fees. The Board estimates that 31,371 persons will avail themselves of one or more of the enumerated services in a two year period.

(16) Describe the communications with and input from the public in the development and drafting of the regulation. List the persons and/or groups who were involved, if applicable.

These regulations do not place requirements on licensees concerning their conduct or compliance with state law regarding the performance of a licensing duty under licensing statutes. The regulation embodies the fees which capture the cost of providing the service an applicant or licensee requests. Therefore, the information requested in this item is not applicable.

(17) Provide a specific estimate of the costs and/or savings to the regulated community associated with compliance, including any legal, accounting or consulting procedures which may be required.

The Board estimates that 31,371 persons will avail themselves of one or more of the enumerated services within a biennial period. Total aggregate additional cost for the regulated community for a biennial period would be approximately \$1,204,345.00 However only those requesting the services will be affected. No legal, accounting or consulting procedures will be implicated in complying with the regulatory amendments.

PROPOSED RULEMAKING COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA DEPARTMENT OF STATE BUREAU OF PROFESSIONAL AND OCCUPATIONAL AFFAIRS 49 PA. CODE, CHAPTER 21 STATE BOARD OF NURSING FEES The State Board of Nursing ("Board") proposes to amend its regulations at 49 Pa. Code §§21.5, 21.147, and 21.253 by revising certain application fees as set forth in Annexes A, B and C.

#### A. Effective Date

The amendments would be effective upon publication of the final form regulations in the <u>Pennsylvania Bulletin</u>.

#### B. Statutory Authority

The amendments are authorized under Section 11.2(a) and (d) of the Professional Nursing Law, Act of May 22, 1951, P.L. 317, <u>as amended</u>, 63 P.S. §221.2(a) and (d) and under §17.5(a) of the Practical Nurse Law, Act of March 2, 1956, P.L. (1995) 1211, <u>as amended</u>, 63 P.S. §667.5(a).

#### C. Background and Purpose

Sections 11.2(a) and (d) of the Professional Nursing Law and section 17.5(a) of the Practical Nursing Law require the Board to set fees by regulation so that revenues meet or exceed expenditures over a biennial period. General operating expenses of the Board are funded through biennial license renewal fees. Expenses related to applications or services which are provided directly to individual licensees or applicants are excluded from general operating revenues and are funded through fees in which the cost of providing the service forms the basis for the fee.

In a recent systems audit of the operations of the Board within the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs, the fees for services for licensees and applicants were analyzed to determine if the fees reflected the actual cost of providing the services. Actual cost calculations are based upon the following formula:

Number of Minutes to Perform the Function

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Pay rate for the classification of the personnel performing the function

+

A proportionate share of administrative overhead

As a result of the audit, the Board proposes to increase seven existing fees and to add four new fees for services which had previously not resulted in a charge to the applicant. The analysis determined that current fees do not accurately reflect the actual cost of providing the following services: license applications by endorsement, license applications for out-of-state graduates; reactivation after five years of inactivity; temporary practice permits; certified registered nurse practitioner (CRNP) certification; applications for new nursing program approval; and review and challenge of registered nurse (RN) and practical nurse (PN) examination.

Board fees for license applications by endorsement, CRNP certification, and certification of scores have not been revised since 1987. Fees for out-of-state graduate license applications, temporary practice permits, new nursing program approval applications, and challenge of the RN and PN examinations have not been revised since 1991, and the fee for reactivating a license after five years of inactivity was last revised in 1993. The fee charged for review and challenge of the RN examination exceeds actual costs, but all other fees fell short of the cost to provide the service. The fees for license restoration after a sanction, applications for extending a temporary practice permit, certification of scores and certification of license history are proposed to reflect the actual cost of providing these services.

In this proposal, fees for the services identified would be adjusted to allocate costs to those who use the service or application. The Board would continue to apportion its enforcement and operating costs to the general licensing population when the Board makes its biennial reconciliation of revenues and expenditures.

#### E. Compliance with Executive Order 1996-1

In accordance with the requirements of Executive Order 1996-1 (February 6, 1996), in drafting and promulgating the regulation the Board considered the least restrictive alternative to regulate costs for services requested by licensees and applicants.

#### F. Fiscal Impact and Paperwork Requirements

The proposed amendments will have no adverse fiscal impact on the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fees will have a modest fiscal impact on those members of the private sector who apply for services from the Board. The amendments will impose no additional paperwork requirements upon the Commonwealth, political subdivisions or the private sector.

### G. Sunset Date

The Board continuously monitors the cost effectiveness of its regulations. Therefore, no sunset date has been assigned.

#### H. Regulatory Review

Pursuant to Section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act, the Act of June 30, 1989 (P.L. 73, No. 19), <u>as amended</u>, 71 P.S. §745.5(a), the Board submitted a copy of this proposed regulation on \_\_\_\_\_\_\_, to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission ("Commission") and the Chairmen of the House Professional Licensure Committee and the Senate Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure Committees"). In addition to submitting the regulation, the Board has provided the Commission and the Committees with a copy of a detailed regulatory analysis form prepared by the Board in compliance with Executive Order 1996-1, "Regulatory Review and Promulgation". A copy of this material is available to the public upon request.

Pursuant to Section 5(g) of the Regulatory Review Act, if the Commission has

any objections to any portion of the proposed regulation, it will notify the Board within 10 days of the close of the committees' review period. Such notification shall specify the regulatory review criteria which have not been met by that portion. The Regulatory Review Act specifies detailed procedures for review, prior to final publication of the regulation, by the Board, the General Assembly and the Governor, of objections raised.
