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

Dear Bob:

With the passage of HMO reforms in Act 68 this past June, we'll soon need to busy ourselves with the crafting of regulations to implement this law, scheduled to go into effect in January, 1999.

One of the areas of great anticipation to doctors and hospitals is the requirement that their bills be paid within 45 days. Of concern, however, is the latitude granted to HMOs where the bill is in some way considered as "contested". Already today, HMOs are apparently withholding payment of substantial bills by contesting very small items or insignificant portions of the bill. Payment of a bill for \$12,000, for example, might be delayed over an individual charge for \$100. The result is lost interest to the provider and the collection of interest on the use of that money by the HMO, while the "dispute" – whether real or trumped up – is ironed out.

I'd like to suggest that in writing the regulations to implement the "45-day payment" provision in Act 68, IRRC incorporate a requirement which says:

"Uncontested bills, and all undisputed portions of contested bills must be paid within 45 days of submission/mailing/receipt or such bills or portions thereof shall incur the interest and penalty provisions of Act 68."

If we're able to have such language included in the regulation, perhaps we can streamline the flow of payments to our medical providers and limit contests over bills to situations where a true controversy exists.
