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Regulation 16A-499

State Board of Nursing and State Board of Medicine

Original: 2064

PROPOSAL: Regulation 16A-499 amends 49 PA Code, Chapter 18, regulations of the State Board of Medicine, and Chapter 21, regulations of the State Board of Nursing. Section 15(b) of the Medical Practice Act of 1985, 63 P.S. Sec. 422.15(b), authorizes the boards to promulgate regulations which would authorize Certified Registered Nurse Practitioners to prescribe medications. The House Professional Licensure Committee approved the regulation package at a meeting held on June 13, 2000. However, the regulation package has been resubmitted by the Boards pursuant to Section 7 (c) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. Sec. 745.7(c)), after the regulations were disapproved by the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) on July 13, 2000. The disapproval order was issued by the IRRC on September 11, 2000. The Boards have amended the regulations to address the objections raised by the IRRC.

Regulation 16A-499 is Final Rulemaking which was delivered to the Professional Licensure Committee on October 2, 2000. The Professional Licensure Committee has until October 22, 2000, to approve or disapprove the regulation.

ANALYSIS: The IRRC objected to Sections 18.57 and 21.287 of the final regulations, which restricted physicians to collaborating with no more than two prescribing CRNPs, on the basis that these sections had not appeared in the proposed regulations. There was no explanation by the Boards as to how this ratio was determined or why such a ratio would be appropriate. The Boards have amended these sections to eliminate any limitation on the number of prescribing CRNPs with whom a physician could collaborate. However, a physician would be permitted to supervise no more than four prescribing CRNPs at any given time. For example, a physician would be permitted to supervise four CRNPs who work in the morning, and four other CRNPs who work in the afternoon.

The IRRC also objected to Sections 18.53(2) and 21.283(2), which required prescribing CRNPs to have completed a specific course in advanced pharmacology of not less than 45 hours, on the basis that currently practicing CRNPs could not be reasonably expected to comply with that provision. The IRRC recommended that the regulation should allow all CRNPs the opportunity to demonstrate an equivalency of the 45-hour advanced pharmacology course to the Boards. The Boards have amended these sections to adopt the IRRC's recommendation. Regulation 16A-499 remains unchanged in all other respects.

RECOMMENDATIONS: It is recommended that the Professional Licensure Committee approve the regulation.
