Regulation No. 57-207 Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission Natural Gas Choice and Competition

On September 20, 1999, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (Commission) received this proposed regulation from the Pennsylvania Public Utility Commission. This rulemaking amends 52 Pa. Code Section 53.69. The authority for this regulation is the Natural Gas Customer Choice and Competition Act (66 Pa. C.S. § 1307(f)(1)(II)). The proposed regulation was published in the October 2, 1999 Pennsylvania Bulletin with a 30-day public comment period. The final-form regulation was submitted to the Commission on May 17, 2000.

This regulation requires a natural gas distribution company with annual revenues in excess of \$40 million - that reconciles its gas costs more often than quarterly - to offer a fixed rate option to customers. The fixed rate option would be annually reconciled with actual gas costs.

This regulation meets the criteria of the Regulatory Review Act.
