Re: Regulation #59-07 (IRRC #2105) Coroners' Education Board Education Requirements

Dear Mr. Norris:

On April 6, 2001, we discussed with your staff an issue concerning the just cause exemption from continuing education requirements. This exemption appears in three provisions of the final-form regulation. However, the Coroners' Education Board Law (16 P.S. § 9525.5) does not authorize the Board to postpone compliance with continuing education requirements for just cause. Although the Board amended the definition of "Just-Cause" to delete the reference to continuing education, it did not remove the just cause exemption from the regulation.

Additionally, the term "Just-Cause" in Section 199.1 contains a hyphen. However, the term is not hyphenated throughout the remainder of the regulation. Furthermore, *Black's Law Dictionary* does not hyphenate the term.

These issues could be resolved through the tolling procedure. Therefore, we recommend that you toll the review period to consider revising Sections 199.1, 199.49, 199.50 and 199.52 as discussed below:

- 1. Section 199.1 defines the term "Just-Cause." The hyphen should be deleted.
- 2. Section 199.49 lists the notification procedures followed by the Board if a coroner fails to meet the continuing education requirements, "unless the Board has postponed compliance for Just Cause." This provision should be amended to delete the reference to postponing compliance with the continuing education requirements for just cause.

- 3. Section 199.50 lists the notification procedures followed by the Board if a chief deputy or full-time deputy coroner fails to meet the continuing education requirements, "unless the Board has postponed compliance for Just Cause." This provision should also be amended to delete the reference to postponing compliance with the continuing education requirements for just cause.
- 4. Section 199.52 addresses just cause extensions of time for completing continuing education requirements. This provision should be deleted.

If the Department chooses to toll the review period, it must deliver written notice to both the Standing Committees and the Commission on the same day. The written notice must be delivered prior to any Standing Committee action on the regulation, or before the end of the Standing Committee's review period on April 17, 2001, whichever occurs first.

As required by Section 307.5 of our regulations, written notice must include:

- 1. A citation to the section(s) the Department is considering revising,
- 2. A description of the revisions being contemplated, and
- 3. An explanation of how the revisions will satisfy our concerns.

If the Commission objects to tolling the review period, we will notify you and the Standing Committees within two business days after receipt of your tolling notice. In the event the Commission objects to your tolling notice, the review period will not be tolled, and the Commission will consider the regulation at our public meeting on April 19, 2001. If the Commission does not object, the review period is tolled for up to 30 days beginning with receipt of your letter and ending on the day you resubmit the regulation.

Dear Mr. Nyce:

The Independent Regulatory Review Commission has questioned the statutory authority of various sections of the final form regulations # 59-07 (relating to the Coroners' Education Board) that were submitted for review to IRRC and the appropriate standing committees on March 28, 2001. These concerns first were expressed by IRRC in comments to the proposed regulations. The Board agreed that the regulations should be amended to address these concerns. The failure of the final form regulations to respond to IRRC's previously stated concerns was a clerical oversight.

On behalf of the Coroners' Education Board, I am requesting a tolling of the time period for final form regulations in accordance with section 5.1(g) of the Regulatory Review Act. Such tolling would permit revision of: section 199.23 (relating to postponement for just cause); section 199.49 (relating to failure of coroners to meet continuing education requirements); section 199.50 (relating to failure of chief deputy coroner or full-time deputy coroner to meet continuing education requirements); and deletion of section 199.52 (relating to extension of time to complete continuing education requirements).

Section 199.23 is revised by deleting the language "or completion of any other provision of the act." This revision brings those areas in which the Board is able to exercise discretion to postpone compliance for just cause in line with its statutory authority. Sections 199.49 and 199.50 are revised by removing language referencing the Board's ability to exercise discretion to postpone continuing education requirements for coroners, chief deputy coroners and full-time deputy coroners. Section 199.52 (relating to extension of time to complete continuing education requirements) is

entirely deleted. These revisions are necessitated by the absence of any provision in the Coroners' Education Board Law (16 P.S. § 9525.1--9525.6) which would permit the Board to exercise discretion to postpone compliance with continuing education requirements.

With this tolling request, the Board is simultaneously submitting a revised Annex and Preamble which reflect the above-described changes to the final form regulations.
