Yes. The Board is required by statute to adopt regulations setting fees. See Item No. 9 for the specific law.

(11) Explain the compelling public interest that justifies the regulation. What is the problem it addresses?

The enabling statute requires the Board to set fees by regulation so that revenues meet or exceed expenditures over a biennial period. The general operating expenses of the Board are borne by the licensee population through revenue generated by the biennial renewal of licenses. Expenses related to specific services which are provided directly to individual licensees or applicants are excluded from general operating revenues so that only the licensee who uses a particular service pays for a service being provided to him or her. By this regulation, the cost of providing the service will be accurately apportioned to users of the services.

(12) State the public health, safety, environmental or general welfare risks associated with nonregulation.

At the present time the Board collects no fees to match the actual costs of reviewing the subject applications and providing the subject services. Therefore, the costs of these specific services fall on the shoulders of the general licensing population.

(13) Describe who will benefit from the regulation. (Quantify the benefits as completely as possible and approximate the number of people who will benefit.)

The licensing population generally will benefit by having costs of services which are utilized by only a portion of the licensees or applicants paid by those persons actually using the service.

The Board is not aware of any persons or groups who would be adversely affected by the regulation. Applicants for service or licensees will be required to bear the up-to-date costs of providing the services involved.

Applicants for course approval, for change of sponsor, change of auction house or auction company license, non-resident exam eligibility review, certification of scores, permit or registration and verification of license, registration, permit or approval will be required to comply with the regulation by paying the applicable fees.

These regulations do not place requirements on licensees concerning their conduct or compliance with state law regarding the performance of a licensing duty under licensing statutes. The regulation embodies fees which capture the cost of providing the service an applicant or licensee requests. Therefore, the information requested in this item is not applicable.

The Board estimates that 51 persons will avail themselves of one or more of the enumerated services within a biennial period. Total costs to the regulated community for a biennial period would be \$945. However, only those requesting the services will be affected. No federal standards apply.

The majority of Pennsylvania's neighboring states do not license auctioneers. The Board compared fees in the neighboring states which do issue statewide auctioneer licenses, Ohio and West Virginia, and in other eastern states with licensure schemes similar to Pennsylvania, such as Massachusetts and North Carolina. Most of the states surveyed do not charge all of the fees proposed here, but do charge some of them. Overall, Pennsylvania's fees compare favorably to those of other states which do charge these task specific fees. Any disparity in fees is not likely to put Pennsylvania at a competitive disadvantage as these services are rather infrequently requested. (See Paragraph 20a.)

Pennsylvania's proposed fee for continuing education course approval is \$45.00, as compared to North Carolina's fee of \$100.00. (None of the other states surveyed require continuing education; some require only minimal education for initial licensure.) Pennsylvania proposes a fee of \$15.00 for application to change sponsor, the other surveyed states which have sponsorship programs charge no fee. Pennsylvania proposes a fee of \$15.00 for change in auction house or company license. Massachusetts, North Carolina, and Ohio have mechanisms to bond auction houses or companies; Massachusetts and North Carolina charge no fee for a change in the license, while Ohio charges \$10.00. Pennsylvania's proposed fee for non-resident exam eligibility review is \$25.00. Ohio charges either \$15.00 or \$25.00, depending on the license applied for, to review eligibility for any applicant. North Carolina breaks down its \$250.00 license fee to include a \$50.00 fee for eligibility review for applicants. Pennsylvania proposes a fee of \$25.00 to certify scores or registration, and a fee of \$15.00 to verify licensure. None of the surveyed states charges a fee for certification or verifications services.

The State Board of Auctioneer Examiners (Board) proposes to amend 49 Pa. Code §1.41 (pertaining to fees) by revising those fees which are not related to license renewals but reflect the cost of processing applications and providing services. The proposed changes are set forth in Annex A.

#### A. Effective date.

The amendment will take effect when published as final rulemaking in the <u>Pennsylvania</u> Bulletin.

#### B. Statutory Authority.

Section 6(a) of the Auctioneer and Auction Licensing Act (Act), Act of December 22, 1983, P.L. 327, as amended, 63 P.S. §734.6(a), requires the Board to establish fees by regulation. The same provision requires the Board to increase fees to meet or exceed projected expenditures if the revenues raised by fees, fines and civil penalties are not sufficient to match expenditures.

#### C. Background and Purpose.

The Act requires the Board to set fees by regulation so that revenues meet or exceed expenditures. General operating expenses of the Board are funded through biennial license renewal fees which are paid by all licensees. Expenses of the Board which are related to processing individual applications or providing certain services directly to individual licensees or applicants are excluded from general operating revenues. These expenses are funded through fees which are based on the cost of providing the service. These application and service fees are the focus of this proposed rulemaking.

A recent systems audit of the operations of this and other boards within the Bureau of Professional and Occupational Affairs analyzed the fees for services to licensees and applicants to determine if the fees reflected the actual cost of providing the services. Actual cost calculations are based on the following formula:

number of minutes to perform the function

x

pay rate of personnel performing the function

#### a proportionate share of administrative overhead.

The Board's fee schedule at §1.141 was last amended in 1998 when the Board adopted biennial renewal fee increases to balance a projected deficit in the Board's anticipated revenues and expenses. However, the fee structure of §1.141 incorporated that established by the 1978 BPOA Fee Act (63 P.S. §1401-203) which established fees only for examination, licenses and renewals. The present auctioneer law was enacted in 1983 and among other things gave the Board authority to regulate auction houses and companies and approved schools. As a result of the systems audit referred to above the Board identified activities resulting from regulatory requirements for these entities.

In this proposal, the Board would establish six new fees identified in the Bureau audit as attributable to requests by individual licensees for services or Board approval or action required by the act or regulation. By establishing these fees the Board proposes that these licensees will pay their proportionate share of the cost to provide the service and reserve renewal revenue for general operating and enforcement expenses.

The State Board of Auctioneer Examiners mandates prescribed programs of study in its regulations at 49 Pa. Code §1.11. The Board now proposes a fee to cover the costs of the approval process in reviewing a course for which an applicant wants to receive credit, where the course is outside the prescribed course of study.

The Board also proposes a fee for applications to change sponsor. Sponsors are licensed auctioneers who agree to supervise apprentice auctioneers under Section 5(b) of the Act (63 P.S. §734.5(b)), an apprentice auctioneer license is valid only when that apprentice has a sponsoring auctioneer; the apprentice must submit a transfer form and obtain a reissued license each time she secures a new sponsor.

The Act at Sections 9 and 10(d), (63 P.S. §734.9, 10(d)), require auction house and auction company licensees to notify the Board of change in ownership, name and location of the auction house or company. The Board now proposes a fee to process these applications for changes in auction house or company licenses.

The Act at Section 11 (63 P.S. §734.11), provides for licensure of nonresidents upon their compliance with the conditions for licensure required of Commonwealth residents. The Board currently does not charge a fee for the time involved in reviewing nonresident qualifications to determine eligibility to sit for the licensing exam. The Board now proposes a fee for this service.

Currently the Board charges no fees for the actual cost of processing the following: an

application to approve course; an application to change sponsor; an application to change auction house or auction company license; nonresident examination eligibility review; certification of scores, permit or registration; and verification of license registration, permit or approval.

Verification of scores, permit or registration involves a brief and simple electronic search of the Board's computerized licensure records for the subject licensee. This process takes about five minutes. Certification of scores, permit or registration is a more labor intensive function which may require Board staff to search electronically and manually through extensive computer, microfilm and paper files to compile various pieces of information regarding the subject's education, examination and/or training. That information is then compiled into one document. The certification process takes about forty-five minutes.

The Bureau's costs calculations allowed the Board to establish fees for the services identified in this proposal, which fees would allocate costs to those who use the service or submit the application.

The Board proposes a new fee of \$45 to cover the cost of processing applications to approve a course; a \$15 fee to cover the cost of processing applications to change sponsors, and a \$15 fee to cover the cost of processing an application to change auction house or auction company license. In addition, the Board proposes a new fee of \$25 to cover the cost of performing nonresident examination eligibility review; a new fee of \$25 to cover the cost of processing certifications of scores, permits or registration; and a new fee of \$15 to cover the cost of processing verification of license, registration, permit or approval. The Board currently incurs staff costs in administrative overhead in providing these services without fee.

#### E. Compliance with Executive Order 1996-1

In accordance with the requirements of Executive Order 1996-1 (February 1, 1996), in drafting and promulgating the regulation the Board considered the regulations as both required by law and the least restrictive means of covering the costs of services requested by licensees and applicants.

#### F. Fiscal Impact and Paperwork Requirements

The proposed amendments will have no adverse fiscal impact on the Commonwealth or its political subdivisions. The fees will have a very modest fiscal impact on those members of the private sector who apply for services from the Board. The amendments will not impose additional paperwork requirements upon the Commonwealth, political subdivisions or the private sector.

#### G. Sunset Date

The Board continuously monitors the cost effectiveness of its regulations. Therefore, no sunset date has been assigned.

#### H. Regulatory Review

If the Commission has any objections to any portion of the proposed regulation, it will notify the agency within ten days after the expiration of the Committees' review period. Such notification shall specify the regulatory review criteria which have not been met by that portion. The Act specifies detailed procedures for review of objections prior to final publication of the regulation, by the agency, the General Assembly and the Governor, of objections raised.
