Dear Executive Director Nyce:

The IRRC will again be reconsidering the elimination of the Pennsylvania Special Education Standards (Chapter 342) and the complete revision of the Pennsylvania Special Education Regulations (Chapter 14) on April 5, 2001. As the IRRC did in March by a 4-1 margin, this letter is written to once again reiterate my opposition to the "changed" submission to the IRRC by the State Board of Education. The changes are cosmetic and the regulations are, in substance, "essentially unchanged from the version that you rejected in March..." (That is also the opinion of the Education Law Center that has analyzed the "changes" in its letter to you dated March 25, 2001. I have been favored with a copy of the Education Law Center's letter to you and would respectfully suggest that the concerns in that letter expressed by one of the most respected advocates in the United States for children with disabilities be seriously considered).

I would indicate that I am in receipt of a letter dated February 26, 2001 to Chairman McGinley from Senators Schwartz, Lavalle, Hughes and Kukovich – members all of the Senate Education Committee – expressing their recommendations to the IRRC "to disapprove Final Form Regulation #6-270". I concur with those Members of the General Assembly requesting disapproval. I would, however, indicate that the specific objections enumerated by the Senators, while valid (and indeed at least one appears to be violative of federal law), are not the only objections that our office finds with these proposed regulations. For instance, as a Member of the Judiciary Committee I have been conducting meetings with the Attorney General's Office, the Pennsylvania Bar Association and staff of my office and the Judiciary Committee over the very complex change involving the utilization of lay advocates in due process hearings.

For the first time at the last IRRC meeting, families, advocates and legislators were finally heard. The arguments have not changed. The regulations have not improved.

For a multitude of reasons which have been expressed in my earlier correspondence with the Independent Regulatory Review Commission, my correspondence with the Senate and House Education Committees and my correspondence with the Board of Education and Pennsylvania Department of Education, I urge the Independent Regulatory Review Commission to disapprove Final Form Regulation #6-270.
