Regulation No. 30-56
Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency
Prohibition of Nonessential Water Uses in a
Commonwealth Drought Emergency Area

On October 24, 2000, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (Commission) received this proposed regulation from the Pennsylvania Emergency Management Agency (PEMA). This rulemaking amends 4 Pa. Code Chapter 119. The proposed regulation was published in the November 4, 2000, *Pennsylvania Bulletin* with a 30-day public comment period. Pursuant to Section 5(e) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5(e)), the Department resubmitted the proposed regulation on January 30, 2001. The final-form regulation was submitted to the Commission on May 31, 2001.

This regulation expands the effective emergency area to include the complete service area of any public water supply agency whose source of water is located in the declared emergency area. Definitions have been added to clarify the meanings of athletic field, newly seeded and sodded grass, effective conservation, professional landscaper and irrigation contractor.

We have determined this regulation is consistent with the statutory authority of PEMA (35 Pa. C.S.A. § 7313) and the intention of the General Assembly. Having considered all of the other criteria of the Regulatory Review Act, we find promulgation of this regulation is in the public interest.
