Regulation 16A-444

State Board of Podiatry

PROPOSAL: Regulation 16A-444 amends 49 PA Code, Chapter 29, regulations of the State Board of Podiatry. The amendment identifies two nationally recognized examinations, taken in sequential order, as the current licensing examinations. The amendment also makes revisions to the schedule of Board fees by increasing certain fees, reducing one fee, adding certain fees for services for which there are currently no fees, and eliminating references to examination fees.

Regulation 16A-444 is Final Rulemaking which was delivered to the Professional Licensure Committee on December 6, 2001. The Professional Licensure Committee has until December 26, 2001 to approve or disapprove the regulation.

<u>ANALYSIS:</u> Pursuant to Sec. 14 of the Podiatry Practice Act, 63 P.S. Sec. 42.14, the Board is required to meet expenditures through revenues raised by fees, fines and civil penalties. The Board is required to increase fees so that projected revenues will meet or exceed projected expenditures. Fees for various services provided directly to applicants or licensees are based upon the actual charge of providing the service requested. The Board states that the following fees would be changed to reflect the actual cost of providing the service:

The Board's licensure examination has two parts. The first part is the examination given by the National Board of Podiatric Medical Examiners. Applicants who pass that part are then permitted to take the PM Lexis examination. Both are nationally recognized examinations, with fees established by the owners/providers of the exams. Since the Board has no control over the fees, specific references to the fees have been eliminated, and applicants directed to pay the fees directly to the providers.

RECOMMENDATIONS: It is recommended that the Professional Licensure Committee approve the regulation.
