Regulation No. 6-273 State Board of Education Academic Standards and Assessment

On April 11, 2001, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (Commission) received this proposed regulation from the State Board of Education (Board). This rulemaking amends 22 Pa. Code Chapter 4. The proposed regulation was published in the April 21, 2001 *Pennsylvania Bulletin* with a 30-day public comment period. The final-form regulation was submitted to the Commission on October 12, 2001.

The regulation establishes specific academic standards for the subject areas of Science and Technology and Environment and Ecology. The standards describe what students are expected to know by the end of the fourth, seventh, tenth and twelfth grades.

We have determined this regulation is consistent with the statutory authority of the Board (24 P.S. § 26-2603-B(k)) and the intention of the General Assembly. Having considered all of the other criteria of the Regulatory Review Act, we find promulgation of this regulation is in the public interest.
