Dear Environmental Quality Board

Please strengthen the proposed rules for Public Notification and Consumer Confidence Reports that were recently published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.

Receiving timely and accurate information about the quality of drinking water is very important to protect our health.

I urge you to make the following changes to the proposed rules:

Public Notification Rule:

- Require all utilities to notify the media within 24 hours whenever their water violates a state drinking water standard.
- Require utilities to use multiple methods to notify the public, especially for the most serious violations.

Consumer Confidence Reports:

- Make sure that Consumer Confidence Reports (CCR's) list specific polluters by name when reliable data is available from government reports or databases.
- Require that CCR's be sent to all consumers, not just bill paying customers.
- Make sure that CCR's include health effect information for all detected contaminants.

Please strengthen the proposed rules for Public Notification and Consumer Confidence Reports that were recently published in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.

Receiving timely and accurate information about the quality of drinking water is very important to protect our health.

I urge you to make the following changes to the proposed rules:

Public Notification Rule:

- Require all utilities to notify the media within 24 hours whenever their water violates a state drinking water standard.
- Require utilities to use multiple methods to notify the public, especially for the most serious violations.

Consumer Confidence Reports:

- Make sure that Consumer Confidence Reports (CCR's) list specific polluters by name when reliable data is available from government reports or databases.
- Require that CCR's be sent to all consumers, not just bill paying customers.
- Make sure that CCR's include health effect information for all detected contaminants.

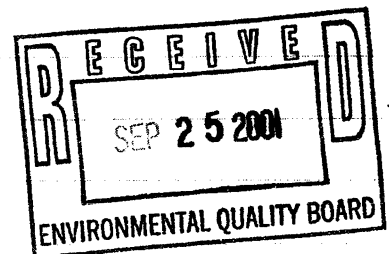

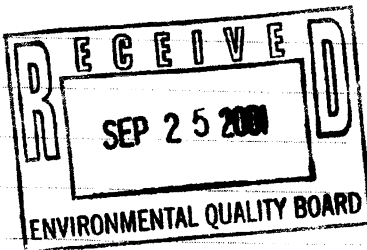

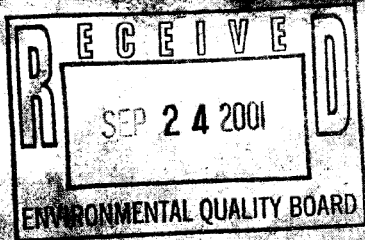
