Especially during this time in our nation's history where we must be on alert about possible terrorist plots to use chemical warfare, the quality of our drinking water should be closely monitored and all possible hazards disclosed to the public at large. I thank you for the work you have done thus far and I urge you to continue to protect the citizens of Pennsylvania.

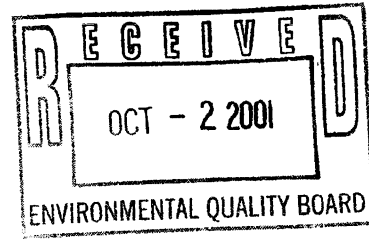
