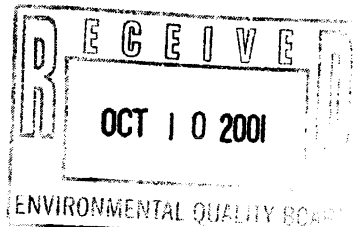

Gentlemen:

I wish to address what is on the reverse side of this sheet. The public, I feel, most definitely has the right to know anytime the drinking water is being affected — not 24 hours after the fact, but at least 72 hours BEFORE the fact. If polluters contaminate our water, their names should be immediately forwarded to the police for prompt, disciplinary action. In an age where, since the 11th of September, 2001, terrorists are threatening our very way of existence in any way they can — and the drinking water comes to us as an obvious possibility — it seems to me that we don't need American polluters adding to our troubles. Water, more than any one thing, is necessary for the sustenance of life. This must be kept clear and free of contaminants at all costs and unceasingly. Anything less is totally unacceptable. In the words, slightly altered, that attorney Joseph W. Welch gave to U.S. Senator Joseph McCarthy, on June 9, 1954: "Let us not assassinate [our people] for their. You have done enough. Have you [sic], at long last, no sense of decency. Have you left no sense of decency?" That's all I have to say.

Any known polluter of our water supply should be stopped and prosecuted. The public should know who these offenders are and make sure the offenders are stopped or monitored continuously.

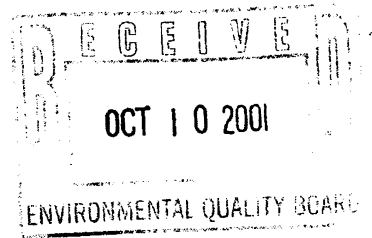
