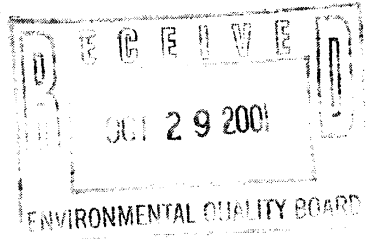
We also would like to know why Pennsylvania is a dumping area for other states? Why can't other states take care of their own garbage.

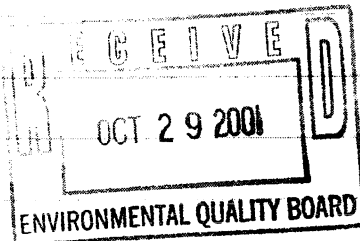

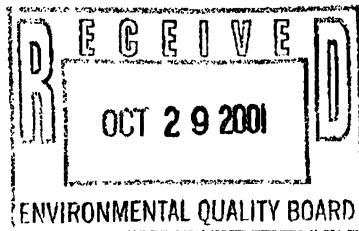

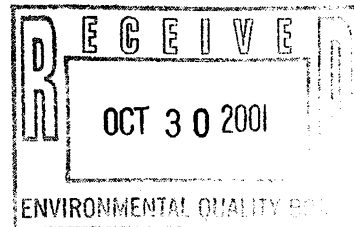

RE: Comments of the Water Utility Council of the American Water Works Association to the Proposed Regulation – Chapter 109 (Relating to Safe Drinking Water)

Dear Sir or Madame:

The National Association of Water Companies, Pennsylvania Chapter (NAWC) is a trade association representing many of Pennsylvania's investor-owned water utilities. Its 22 member companies provide reliable drinking water to more than 3.5 million Pennsylvanians everyday in 43 of the Commonwealth's 67 counties.

The purpose of the proposed rulemaking package is to amend the Department's Safe Drinking Water regulations to incorporate new primacy requirements contained in three Federal rulemakings. Of particular interest to the NAWC are the new Consumer Confidence Report (CCR) requirements.

**Consumer Confidence Report Amendments (CCR) –** Comments are requested on the basic elements of the CCR, in particular the requirement for a community water system with a large proportion of non-English speaking residents (as determined by the Department) to include information in its report in the appropriate languages regarding the importance of the report or contain a telephone number or address where those residents may contact the system to obtain a translated copy of the report or assistance in the appropriate language. Also, comments are requested on whether a copy of the CCR should be delivered to all consumers.

The CCR amendments will affect all 2,201 community water systems that serve a total population of over 10.5 million Pennsylvanians. It is estimated that water systems in Pennsylvania will bear over \$950,000 of the total (\$23 million) annual cost. The \$950,000 estimate includes costs for preparing, printing and mailing the CCR.

The report shall contain information that is already collected by community water systems; i.e., information on the sources of supply, levels of detected contaminants, violations of any State regulations and health information concerning drinking water and potential risks from detected contaminants.

The NAWC strongly supports the requirement that community water systems prepare and provide to their customers an annual CCR, allowing them to make informed public health decisions concerning the water they are served. However, it is our position that the new CCR requirements should be no more stringent than the provisions of the Federal CCR Rule that were mandated by the 1996 Safe Drinking Water Act (SDWA).

Moreover, as the technology and information age continues to expand each year, we are required to deliver the CCR, at a considerable cost, in an antiquated fashion with little demand or interest from the public we serve. Unfortunately, it is our estimation that only a small portion of the customer base (less than 10 percent) actually reads the CCR or makes use of its contents.

We believe that, as an alternative to mailing CCRs to all customers, community water suppliers should be given the option of posting their CCR on their web site and merely notify customers of its availability online through bill inserts or advertisement in a newspaper of general circulation. Notification of CCR availability through bill inserts and newspaper ads would save money, which could be made available for other drinking water needs. Interested customers could access the CCR online or request it in written form by contacting a toll-free number. Public notices could also include the web addresses of the DEP, PA PUC and U.S. EPA for additional information about CCRs and drinking water programs.

Most Pennsylvania residents have access to computers and the World Wide Web at home, work, school or public libraries in their neighborhoods. For those that don't have Internet access, written copies could be provided, upon request, by the community water system. Such a delivery system would be more efficient by allowing all "interested" consumers, not just customers of a particular water system, to review the CCR of their community water system and those of others across the state.

Incidentally, current software technology used for web sites would allow non-English-speaking residents to easily access the CCRs in a multilingual format. Written CCRs would also be available in multilingual form, which can be easily converted via current computer software programs available to community water systems.

In guidance, the EPA suggests a threshold of 10% of the population or 1,000 people, whichever is less, be used when determining whether to provide multilingual information. This proposed requirement is identical to the provision contained in the **Public Notification (PN) Requirements**. If community water systems were given the option of providing such information electronically, via bill inserts, news releases and advertisement in a newspaper of general circulation, there would be no need for the department to devise such an arbitrary definition.



Nevertheless, we believe the 10% of the population level criteria should be dropped. This 10% requirement will be particularly onerous for small systems serving urban areas where the 10% threshold could trigger the multi-lingual requirement for non-English speaking populations of 100 persons or less.

Similarly, we also believe that the number of persons threshold should be increased from 1,000 to 2,500 persons, due to the difficulty of determining the number of non-English speaking residents. Since the census data only provides information regarding the ethnic background of our population, we are left to estimate what portion, if any, of a particular ethnic group is non-English speaking. This would be a gross approximation at best.


Moreover, we believe that the information required to be included in a multi-lingual form in the CCR should be limited to: the notice of importance of the report, a contact, telephone number and address where residents may obtain additional assistance in obtaining a multi-lingual copy. The provisions regarding the multi-lingual notification should match those established for the CCR to simplify administration. Consequently, our comments regarding multi-lingual information also apply to public notification (PN).

Rather than adopting another costly mandate, the department should work with the regulated community and provide us with the option of using available communications technology to more efficiently reach the residents we serve, including those who are non-English speaking.

Finally, we applaud the department's recent action, in response to the September 11, 2001 terrorist attacks, to delete from their web site information on the location of Pennsylvania water supplies. The EPA should follow DEP's lead, if they have not done so already, and such information should be exempted from open records or Freedom of Information laws. We strongly believe that any requirement which identifies sources of supply or any other system facilities, particularly their locations, should be deleted from CCR requirements in order to better maintain and improve system security.
