## Regulation 16A-4510

## State Board of Cosmetology

**PROPOSAL:** Regulation 16A-4510 amends 49 PA Code, Chapter 7, regulations of the State Board of Cosmetology. The amendment deletes references to examination fees from the Board's schedule of fees.

The proposed Rulemaking was published in the <u>Pennsylvania Bulletin</u> on October 13, 2001. The Professional Licensure Committee has until December 3, 2001 to submit comments on the regulation.

**<u>ANALYSIS:</u>** The proposal would delete from the Board's schedule of fees all references to fees for the theory and performance examination for cosmetologists, cosmeticians, manicurists and teachers, and theory examination for managers. The Board states that these fees are set by the third party administrators of the examinations, not by the Board. By deleting references to these fees, the Board avoids the necessity of amending its regulations whenever the examination administrator changes a fee.

**<u>RECOMMENDATIONS</u>**: It is recommended that the Professional Licensure Committee take no formal action until final form regulations are promulgated.
