Regulation No. 7B-3 Department of Conservation and Natural Resources State Parks; General Provisions

On March 13, 2002, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (Commission) received this proposed regulation from the Department of Conservation and Natural Resources (Department). This rulemaking amends 17 Pa. Code Chapter 11. The proposed regulation was published in the March 23, 2002 *Pennsylvania Bulletin* with a 60-day public comment period. The final-form regulation was submitted to the Commission on September 20, 2002.

The regulation is a comprehensive update, reorganization and streamlining of existing provisions for State parks. In 2001, the Department reports that 36 to 38 million visitors entered the State parks. The fiscal impact of this regulation on the Commonwealth, local governments and State park visitors will be minimal.

We have determined this regulation is consistent with the statutory authority of the Department (71 P.S. § 1340.313) and the intention of the General Assembly. Having considered all of the other criteria of the Regulatory Review Act, we find promulgation of this regulation is in the public interest.
