Regulation 16A-5712

State Board of Veterinary Medicine

PROPOSAL: Regulation 16A-5712 amends 49 PA Code, Chapter 31, regulations of the State Board of Veterinary Medicine. The amendment would add a provision to Section 31.21 (relating to professional conduct) regarding the prescribing, dispensing, packaging and labeling of drugs by veterinarians.

The proposed Rulemaking was published in the <u>Pennsylvania Bulletin</u> on June 22, 2002. The Professional Licensure Committee has until August 12, 2002 to submit comments on the regulation.

<u>ANALYSIS:</u> The Board currently has no regulations addressing the issues of prescribing, dispensing, packaging and labeling of drugs by veterinarians. Accordingly, the Board proposes adding Principle 8, pertaining to drugs, to its regulations regarding professional conduct.

The definition for "drug" is provided in subsection (a). Subsection (b) provides that a veterinarian shall only prescribe prescription drugs to animals that are under the veterinarian's care, which include animals that the veterinarian or one of the veterinarian's licensed associates has examined. Subsection (c) provides that prescription drugs dispensed by a veterinarian, other than drugs for food animals, shall be dispensed in child resistant packaging or in the manufacturer's original packaging.

Subsection (d) lists 9 items that must be included in the labeling of a prescription drug when dispensed by a veterinarian. Subsection (e) requires that veterinarians dispense or administer only drugs that are within the expiration date specified by the manufacturer and that will not expire during the prescribed treatment period. Subsection (f) requires that upon request a veterinarian shall provide a client with a written prescription for an animal that is under the veterinarian's care, except that a veterinarian may refuse to do so if the veterinarian has a good faith belief that the prescription may be misused.

RECOMMENDATIONS: It is recommended that the Professional Licensure Committee take no formal action until final form regulations are promulgated.
