Regulation No.10-165 Department of Health Hearing Aid Sales and Registration

On June 24, 2002, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (Commission) received this proposed regulation from the Department of Health. This rulemaking amends 28 Pa. Code Chapter 25. The proposed regulation was published in the July 6, 2002 *Pennsylvania Bulletin* with a 30-day public comment period. A final-form version of the regulation was submitted on June 30, 2003. However, this version was withdrawn prior to action on August 13, 2003. A revised final-form regulation was submitted to the Commission on October 22, 2003.

This final-form regulation amends the requirements for hearing aid fitters and dealers and for the sale of hearing aids, based on Act 153 of 1998. These changes include: increased registration fees; requirements for continuing education; and the requirement to provide written disclosure agreements and money-back guarantees.

We have determined this regulation is consistent with the statutory authority of the Department of Health (35 P.S. § 6700-205) and the intention of the General Assembly. Having considered all of the other criteria of the Regulatory Review Act, we find promulgation of this regulation is in the public interest.

This regulation is approved.
