Regulation No. 16A-5211 State Board of Optometry Continuing Education, Fees, Certification to Treat Glaucoma

On August 26, 2003, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (Commission) received this proposed regulation from the State Board of Optometry (Board). This rulemaking amends 49 Pa. Code Chapter 23. The proposed regulation was published in the September 6, 2003 *Pennsylvania Bulletin* with a 30-day public comment period. The final-form regulation was submitted to the Commission on May 26, 2004.

This regulation sets forth the requirements for obtaining therapeutic certification to treat glaucoma and updates continuing education requirements. These revisions were mandated by Act 225 of 2002. In addition to codifying the statutory mandates, the regulation pre-approves continuing education courses offered by certain providers and establishes a \$25 application fee for certification to treat glaucoma.

We have determined this regulation is consistent with the statutory authority of the State Board of Optometry (63 P.S. § 244.3) and the intention of the General Assembly. Having considered all of the other criteria of the Regulatory Review Act, we find promulgation of this regulation is in the public interest.
