Regulation No. 14-490 (#2449) Department of Public Welfare Special MA Eligibility Provisions

On November 16, 2004, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (Commission) received this proposed regulation from the Department of Public Welfare (Department). This rulemaking amends 55 Pa. Code Chapter 140. The proposed regulation was published in the November 27, 2004 *Pennsylvania Bulletin* with a 30-day public comment period. The final-form regulation was submitted to the Commission on February 16, 2007.

This final-form regulation adopts an option contained in the federal Breast and Cervical Cancer Prevention and Treatment Act of 2000 (BCCPT). The BCCPT permits states to provide Medicaid coverage to low-income, uninsured women under 65 years of age who have been screened and determined to need treatment for breast or cervical cancer through the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's National Breast and Cervical Cancer Early Detection Program.

We have determined this regulation is consistent with the statutory authority of the Department (62 P.S. §§ 201(2) and 403(b)) and the intention of the General Assembly. Having considered all of the other criteria of the Regulatory Review Act, we find promulgation of this regulation is in the public interest.
