(8) Briefly explain the regulation in clear and non-technical language.

The amendments would permit clinical supervisors of applicants for licensure as clinical social workers, marriage and family therapists and professional counselors to supervise more than six supervisees in group supervisory sessions within educational, institutional and agency settings. The Act requires an applicant for licensure to, among other things, complete hours of supervised clinical experience. The Board's regulations currently prohibit a supervisor from supervising more than six supervisees at the same time. These regulations would carve out an exception to that rule for group supervision within educational, institutional and agency settings.

(9) State the statutory authority for the regulation and any relevant state or federal court decisions.

Section 6(2) of the Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and Professional Counselors Act (63 P.S. §1906(2)).

(11) Explain the compelling public interest that justifies the regulation. What is the problem it addresses?

The Board had received input from applicants for licensure as well as clinical supervisors expressing concern that the clinical supervision requirement of no more than 6 supervisees in group sessions was overly restrictive. These regulations would allow supervisors in certain settings to supervise more than six supervisees at the same time.

(12) State the public health, safety, environmental or general welfare risks associated with non-regulation.

Absent specific regulations, applicants for licensure would find it difficult to obtain the clinical supervisory experience required by the Act.

(13) Describe who will benefit from the regulation. (Quantify the benefits as completely as possible and approximate the number of people who will benefit.)

Applicants for licensure as clinical social workers, marriage and family therapists and professional counselors as well as supervisors of these applicants would benefit from these regulations in that it will be easier to obtain the clinical supervision required by the Act.

All applicants for licenses as clinical social workers, marriage and family therapists and professional counselors attempting to use group clinical supervisory experience for their required clinical supervision experience as well as all clinical supervisors who provide group supervision in educational, institutional and agency settings will be required to comply with the regulation. In the year 2003, there were 89 applicants for social work licenses, 87 applicants for clinical social work licenses, 33 applicants for marriage and family therapist licenses and 171 applicants for professional counselor licenses.

Prior to drafting this proposed regulation, the Board invited interested parties to comment on a preliminary draft. The Board reviewed and considered all comments and suggestions received by interested parties during the regulatory development process. The following interested parties commented on the amendments: Lehigh University; the Pennsylvania Society for Clinical Social Work; the Pennsylvania Chapter of the National Association of Social Workers; Peg Christopher; Angelo F. Gadaleto; and Roberta Iversen.

> PROPOSED RULEMAKING COMMONWEALTH OF PENNSYLVANIA DEPARTMENT OF STATE

BUREAU OF PROFESSIONAL AND OCCUPATIONAL AFFAIRS STATE BOARD OF SOCIAL WORKERS, MARRIAGE AND FAMILY THERAPISTS AND PROFESSIONAL COUNSELORS 49 PA. CODE, CHAPTERS 47.12c(b)(6) 48.13(b)(6), and 49.13(b)(6) SUPERVISED CLINICAL EXPERIENCE

The State Board of Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and Professional Counselors (Board) proposes to amend its regulations at 49 Pa. Code, Chapters 47, 48 and 49 by amending §§ 47.12c, 48.13 and 49.13(relating to licensed clinical social worker; licensed MFT; and licensed professional counselor), to read as set forth in Annex A. The amendments would exclude group supervisory sessions within educational, institutional and agency settings from the requirement that supervisors supervise no more than six supervisees at the same time.

#### **Effective Date**

The amendments will be effective upon publication of the final-form rulemaking in the Pennsylvania Bulletin.

#### **Statutory Authority**

The amendments are authorized under Section 6(2) of the Social Workers, Marriage and Family Therapists and Professional Counselors Act (act) (63 P.S. §1906(2)).

#### Background and Purpose

Sections 7(d)(3), 7(e)(3) and 7(f)(3) of the act require an applicant for licensure as a clinical social worker, marriage and family therapist and professional counselor to, among other things, complete hours of supervised clinical experience. Sections 47.12c(b)(6), 48.13(b)(6) and 49.13(b)(6) of the regulations pertaining to supervised clinical experience for licensed clinical social workers, licensed marriage and family therapists and licensed professional counselors currently prohibit a supervisor from supervising more than six supervisees at the same time. However, the Board recognizes that group supervision often occurs within educational, institutional and agency settings. In these settings, the Board recognizes that the prohibition of more than six supervisees is overly restrictive and the enforcement of such would result in the exclusion of these sessions from qualifying as supervised clinical experience for purposes of licensure qualification. Accordingly, the Board believes that an exception should be made for these types of group supervisory settings.

#### Fiscal Impact and Paperwork Requirements

The proposed amendments will have no fiscal impact and impose no additional paperwork requirements on the Board or its licensees.

The proposed amendments should not impose any legal, accounting or reporting requirements on the regulated community.

#### Compliance with Executive Order 1996-1

The Board reviewed this rulemaking and considered its purpose and likely impact upon the public and regulated population under the directives of Executive Order 1996-1, Regulatory Review and Promulgation. The Board solicited pre-draft input regarding these amendments

from licensees, professional associations, and educational programs. The Board considered predraft comments in developing this proposal.

#### Regulatory Review

Under section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5(a)), on February 2, 2005, the Board submitted a copy of this proposed rulemaking and a copy of a Regulatory Analysis form to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) and to the Chairpersons of the Senate Consumer Protection and Professional Licensure Committee and the House Professional Licensure Committee. A copy of this material is available to the public upon request.

Under section 5(g) of the Regulatory Review Act IRRC may convey any comments, recommendations or objections to the proposed rulemaking within 30 days of the close of the public comment period. The comments, recommendations or objections shall specify the regulatory review criteria which have not been met. The Regulatory Review Act specifies detailed procedures for review, prior to final publication of the rulemaking, by the Board, the General Assembly, and the Governor of comments recommendations or objections raised.
