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Dear Dr. Hummer:

I am a licensed physician assistant (PA) in Pennsylvania. The proposed changes to Pennsylvania Code Title 49, Chapter 18, relating to physician assistants are needed to update the regulations of physician assistant practice and enhance the care of patients. I am writing to express my support of the proposed changes and to encourage you to do the same.

As the medical board has already approved the changes, they now under review by the legislature, public comment and will then undergo final review by the medical board. On paper, the changes may seem to appear numerous, but in fact they are merely much needed updates that will allow physicians to better utilize their own time and skills. By streamlining chart review and information relay requirements, physicians will still supervise PA's, but will be better able to attend to the needs of patients. The proposed prescription regulation changes will allow patients to access needed treatments more readily.
