The reason I am writing you this letter is to show my support of the proposed changes to Pennsylvania Code Title 49, Chapter 18, relating to physician assistants. Currently, I am a physician assistant student at King's College in Wilkes-Barre, Pennsylvania. I'm completing clinical rotations now and will graduate in August 2006. The care I and my supervising physician will provide for patients will be affected by the proposed changes in a positive manner. They will allow the regulations of my future profession to be updated.

Changing the length of time for chart review and relaying treatment information, along with altering prescription regulations for PAs, are factors that will streamline but not diminish physician supervision and give patients better access to appropriate treatments. The medical board has previously approved theses regulations and the next step is review by the legislature, public comment, and final review by the medical board.

This moderate update of PA regulations in Pennsylvania will allow physicians to utilize PAs both safely and more efficiently.
