Cars and trucks are a significant source of air pollution, contributing approximately one third of the region's smog-forming emissions. The Pennsylvania Clean Vehicles Program would reduce pollution from vehicles more quickly and thoroughly than weaker federal standards. These pollution reductions are crucial for improving air quality and protecting public health in the state.

Thirty-seven counties across Pennsylvania still do not meet the federal government's basic air quality standards. The California Air Resources Board (CARB) has estimated that by 2012, CA-LEV compliant cars (the same cars that the Pennsylvania program would include) will save their owners an average of 1,048 gallons of gasoline over the ten-year life of the car. Today's gas prices are well above \$2.25, but even at that rate, it's savings of \$2,358 in gasoline efficiency alone. Moreover, CARB-certified vehicles have better emissions control systems warranties, which can save their owners additional out-of-pocket repair costs as these vehicles age. Cleaner vehicles will benefit the more than 1,000,000 Pennsylvanians who suffer from breathing problems that are made worse by air pollution. This is very important for older people and children, who are particularly vulnerable to respiratory illnesses like asthma and bronchitis. The American Lung Association of Pennsylvania has reported that children who live in communities with high concentrations of ozone, acid vapor, nitrogen dioxide and particulate pollution are at greater risk of developing chronic breathing problems due to poor lung development than children who live in less-polluted areas. This matters to parents considering moving to or staying in Pennsylvania. Ten other states have already adopted California low emission vehicle standards, the same standards the Pennsylvania program has. These other states are New Jersey, New York, Connecticut, Massachusetts, Rhode Island, Maine, Vermont, Washington, Oregon and of course California. These states represent over 1/3 of the auto sales in the United States. Joining them would allow Pennsylvania to reduce emissions while remaining economically competitive in the region. Action is required to combat global warming ž and reducing greenhouse gas emissions is a critical part of that. Pennsylvania contributes more greenhouse gases to earth's atmosphere than 105 other nations combined. With the proposed amendments to the Clean Vehicles Program rules, we could see our greenhouse gas emissions from new cars and trucks reduced by as much as 30 percent, all at little or no cost to us as consumers. This measure is an easy and cost-effective way to improve our air quality and the health of our planet.
