- These bills won't clean up toxic mercury. They instead require Pennsylvania to follow an illegal federal rule that delays mercury reductions for decades, creating a trading scheme allowing mercury hotspots near dirty power plants to continue.
- Pennsylvania power plants are now the <u>2nd worst</u> mercury polluters in the country, and put out 83% of mercury to our air.
- Babies are at high risk of lifetime health problems from mercury, since it can destroy their developing brains and neurological systems both before and after birth.
