Administration of the Training Program

Description and Purpose

The Pennsylvania State Police, Municipal Police Officers' Education and Training Commission (Commission) amends 37 Pa. Code §203.11(a)(6) (relating to qualifications) allow licensed physician's assistants and certified nurse practitioners to conduct physical examinations, which is consistent with current medical practice.

Statutory Authority

The amendments are authorized by 53 Pa.C.S. § 2164 (1), (8), & (14) (relating to Part III, Subpart C, of the Local Government Code).

Effect

This final-form rulemaking will affect recruits, out-of-state police officers seeking training waivers, and certified schools.

Effective Date/Sunset Date

The amendments will be effective immediately upon final adoption. These regulations are continually monitored and updated as needed. Therefore, no sunset date has been set.

Regulatory Review

On July 10, 2006, copies of the proposed rulemaking were delivered to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission and the Majority and Minority Chairs of the House Judiciary Committee and the Senate Committee on Law and Justice. Notice of the proposed rulemaking was published at 36 Pa. B. 3828 (July 22, 2006) and provided for a 30-day comment period. The Commission received no comments from the public, the Independent Regulatory Review Commission, the House Judiciary Committee, or the Senate Committee on Law and Justice.

Under section 5.1(j.2) of the Regulatory Review Act, this final-form rulemaking was deemed approved by the House and Senate Committees. Under section 5.1(g) of the
