I am writing to comment on the proposed revisions to the PA dog law regulations of Dec. 16, 2006. I do not agree with many of these changes because they do not take into consideration the impracticality of enforcement, let alone the costs which will not improve these dogs life in lands.

I do agree that inhumane and selestandard kernel conditions should not be tolerated. The problem with the proposal is that many small breeders and rescues were not even asked for their assistance in developing these proposed changes.

Some loreders maintain there dogs in their own residences, which are far superior to any regulations the state could come up with, but they would be unable to comply with the rigid commercial standards.
