"...the proposals pertaining to housing and social interaction of dogs of different sizes are contrary to good husbandry, socialization and training practices." Why and what would you recommend?

I have Old English sheepdogs and Lowchens. The sheepdogs average 80 pounds, the Lowchens average 13 - 18 pounds. They get along beautifully together and have great friendships with one another. The OES are very comfortable around their smaller friends and often lie down so that they can play more compatibly. The small dogs love to play "chase" with their big friends. It is easier for me to go to a dog show with one Lowchen and one OES with less heavy equipment to carry and the easier transportability of the smaller dog. I can see NO reason for limiting households to one size of dog. We used to have beagles with the OES and
