My name is Amy Bitting. I volunteer with several animal advocate groups in the Harrisburg-Lancaster area and I have been following the issue of commercial kennels in Pennsylvania for some time. As a concerned citizen of the state of Pennsylvania, I would like to thank the Bureau of Dog Law for proposing new and amended kennel regulations to improve the living conditions of the dogs in commercial breeding kennels.

I fully support the proposed kennel regulations and welcome their passage. The animals deserve better treatment. Increasing the cage requirements, regulating the temperature of the kennels, providing daily exercise, providing lighting and better ventilation and removing from their cage or kennels during cleaning is absolutely a step in the right direction.

Many breeders have expressed their opposition to the new regulations because they are too expensive and time consuming. I ask you, why should the animals have to suffer because someone doesn't want to take the time or spend the money on provide adequate care; care which still is far less than the majority of Pennsylvania residents provide for their on pets?

Many breeders and dog clubs have stated there is no scientific proof for the regulation changes or the changes are against husbandry practices. I spent less than 1 hour searching the internet and found prominent veterinarians and animal behaviorists who have substantiated the type and level of care these animals require for a healthy life. I feel the amended regulations will reflect these current care standards and are necessary to insure humane conditions needed for better overall quality of life.
