Dear Ms. Bender,

I am writing to comment on the proposed amendments to the Pennsylvania dog law regulations issued on Dec.16, 2006. The new regulations seem to be written for large commercial establishments and only large commercial kennels could ever hope to meet some of these outrageous requirements. Some that I have just become aware of are:

- All surfaces the dog comes in contact with must be impervious to water. (so no bedding would be allowed?)
- There must be a ventilation system that provides at least **6 air changes per hour**.(even in a house! and how will this be measured accurately?)
- Records must be kept of the **date and time** when **each dog's** water and food dish is sanitized and refilled. (Who will actually police this?)
- Records must be kept of all walls and floors being "sanitized" once every 24 hours. (even in a house!!)
- Dogs under 35 pounds may not be allowed with dogs over 35 pounds. (even if requested by the owner for a stay in a boarding kennel?)
- Puppies can no longer be raised in homes due to possibly being on carpeting or outside on grass. (not allowed? Buyers want home-raised puppies)

These do not sound like good "home-like" conditions to me, but more like keeping laboratory animals.

I **do believe** that inhumane and substandard kennel conditions should not be tolerated. But I **do not agree** that most of the proposed changes are needed, or would even be necessary if the current laws were enforced. I was told PA has some of the toughest dog laws on the books, yet I also understand that the Bureau has conceded that its current regulations have not been adequately enforced. Maybe that is the real problem.

I therefore urge that this proposal be withdrawn.
