 - 21-24 1/2 round pipe installed to permit dog to walk through. Could this cause injuries?
 - 21-25 [d] Slab temperature 350 to 550. Heat the slab? What about wire temperatures. An elevated resting board.
 - [e] Cooling. Have to A.C. all inside kennels. Move the dogs outside.
 - 21-26 [e] Ground level ventilation. This is another expense that wont be utilized.
