They, after all are the breeders who do no pre-testing, OFA clearances, CERF testing, check parentage backgrounds for possible health issues and on and on. Each National Breed club comes with a code of Ethics. Breeders belonging to those clubs follow that standard. These super multi breed kennels, designer dog kennels and the Puppy mills must be more closely watched. There are little or no health guarantees as the reputable breeders have. I don't feel that these new proposed changes are geared to help that.
