RE: PUC Proposed Regulation – Inspection and Maintenance Standards for the Electric Distribution Companies, PUC Docket Number: L-00040167, IRRC #57-248 (#2571)

Dear Mr. McNulty:

I am requesting the Commission revise above mentioned proposed regulations by removing prescriptive standards time cycles and eliminate the automatic rejection of plans that do not have mandated time cycles. Requesting each company file their inspection and maintenance plans will fulfill any mandate under the Electricity Generation Customer Choice (Act 66 Pa. C.S. Chapter 28). These changes will provide the flexibility for EDC's to determine the appropriate programs and ingrate advances in technology.

This proposal contains prescriptive Inspection and Maintenance Standards which should not be mandated since the electric distribution companies (EDC's) already must follow regulations that are required to meet reliability standards. The existing regulations already require reporting to the PUC under 52 PA Code §57.195 Inspection and Maintenance goals for transmission, substation and distribution. In addition the actual results of inspection and maintenance practices are reported along with the expenditures. The PUC proposed regulations on implementing additional Inspection and Maintenance Standards, which are estimated to cost \$75.3 million with no proven increase in electricity reliability, is not necessary.

The Commission has already proven that companies not meeting the reliability indices/benchmarks can be ordered to improve their reliability. There is no need to mandate

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additional prescriptive standards at considerable cost if the utilities are presently meeting their reliability indices/benchmarks.
