Dear Mr. Radke,

The Sexual Assault Response Team of Allegheny County commends the Department of Health on its proactive stance toward the emergency treatment of individuals who have been the victim of a sexual assault.

The proposed rulemaking related to 28 PA. CODE.CHS. 101 and 117 regarding the minimum requirements, in our opinion, is missing a significant element. The Department of Health should:

- 1. Strongly encourage/recommend that all hospitals utilize certified Sexual Assault Nurse Examiners (SANE's) to perform evaluation and evidence collection within the emergency department.
- 2. In geographic areas where there are SANE programs, that are working in association with the District Attorney's, Office, the hospital should contract with that program to provide standardized examinations.

In 2005, there were 259 reported sexual assaults prosecuted in Allegheny County. The District Attorney's Office was only able to obtain 107 (41%) convictions - largely due to a lack of physical evidence. The lack of physical evidence does not mean that an assault did not take place, but the evidence may not have been properly collected.

Therefore, it is our opinion that adding the above statements within the regulation will strengthen the ability of the judicial system to prosecute these heinous crimes.
