Dear-Mr. Buckheit:

While I understand that the Public Comment period for input specific to Chapter 49-2 has been completed, I am writing to express my concerns regarding the proposed changes to certification requirements in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania.

In May of 2000, I received my teaching certification in the field of special education, which encompasses grades kindergarten through twelve. I have been teaching students who have disabilities since this time, and I have acquired tenure in my local school district. My undergraduate coursework addressed a number of different areas specific to teaching students with disabilities, and I believe this instruction provided me with the foundations to become a highly qualified special education teacher.

Given the shortage of special education teachers, I find that the proposed changes will negatively impact the field in a number of ways. To begin, it is somewhat discouraging that regular education teachers will only have to take a minimum of nine credit hours in the field of special education. Even though I have already received my Level II certification in special education, I am now required to be dually certified and/or highly qualified in at least one content area if I am going to teaching at the secondary level. Further, I chose to be a special education teacher and to work with students with disabilities. This area is my "specialty," and I feel that my expertise in this area, given the proposed changes, will be overlooked. I also believe that preservice teachers who want to work with students with disabilities surrounding teacher certification.

Please consider altering the proposed changes to reflect a more unified approach to certification in the field of special education. I thank-you for your time and attention these concerns.
