Dear Mr. Kaufman:

I am writing to oppose the proposed amendments to the State Board of Education's teacher certification regulations (Chapter 49-2) that are now before the Independent Regulatory Review Commission.

Specifically, I am opposing the <u>grade level structures for the proposed certificates</u> (Early Childhood, Pre K-3 & Elementary/Middle, 4-8) that would eliminate the current Elementary Education Certificate (K-6).

As one of many parents of children who attend a public school in Pennsylvania, I oppose the changes for the following reasons:

- 1. I believe that teachers working with children in the elementary grades should receive training in the widest developmental range possible.
- 2. The elementary certification split seems arbitrary. Grade 4 is developmentally very different from Grade 8, and I do not understand how those grade levels are represented in one certificate in the proposed structures.
- I have heard from teacher educators that the split of Elementary Certificate into two
 proposed certificates may result in a shortage of qualified teachers prepared to teach in
 grades 4-6.
- 4. I have heard from school administrators that this spilt will result in staffing problems for schools that need K-6 flexibility. In my own child's elementary school, an excellent 2nd grade teacher was moved to a 5th to fill a staffing need. With the split such flexibility will not be possible.
- 5. If the changes are proposed in order to strengthen the early childhood education in Pennsylvania, I suggest that we pay greater attention to state-sponsored preschool programs, full-day kindergarten, earlier compulsory school age (currently 8 years), and/or smaller class sizes in grades pre k-2.

I highly recommend keeping the current Elementary Certificate (K-6) and adding a legitimate middle school certificate (6-8).
