It has come to my attention that the Pennsylvania Osteopathic Board of Medicine has recently proposed regulations to allow osteopathic physicians to delegate prescriptions to the PAs they supervise. As physician assistant supervised by a osteopathic physician , I am writing in support of these changes.

I work in a practice with MDs and DOs, and my DO colleagues have found the prescriptive restrictions on their physician assistants frustrating. They recognize the many benefits of giving prescriptive authority to PAs. PAs receive the same training whether they will be supervised by a DO or a MD. Osteopathic physicians should have the same ability to delegate prescriptive authority to their PAs as their MD colleagues.
