I strongly support the proposed osteopathic prescribing regulations for physician assistants and urge that they be worded exactly as the present allopathic regulations, thus avoiding any confusion. It remains of utmost importance that the supervising physician must remain in full command and decide exactly which medications his / her P.A. may prescribe.

It has been proven that physicians and hospitals are much more likely to hire physician assistants if they may authorize prescriptive authority.
