Unfortunately, with the present legislation, the ability for physician assistants working under an osteopathic physician is limited.

As a practicing PA in the state of Pennsylvania for the past eleven years I have had the privilege of working under an osteopath in primary care for nine years. During my tenure in primary care it would be very inconvenient for not only myself but for the patient and my supervising physician to have these restrictions. It ultimately led to the patients limited ability to access timely medical care.
