Proposed Section 247.7(c) states what information should be contained on a SERS nomination of beneficiary form in order for it to be considered valid by SERS. Notice of Proposed Rulemaking State Employees' Retirement Board State Employees' Retirement System (4 Pa. Code Chapter 247)

Preamble

The State Employees' Retirement Board ("Board") proposes to amend 4 Pa. Code, Chapter 247 by adding a subsection to Section 247.7. This new subsection states what information should be contained on a SERS nomination of beneficiary form in order for it to be considered valid by SERS.

A. <u>Effective Date</u>

The proposed regulation will go into effect upon publication in the *Pennsylvania Bulletin* as a final rulemaking.

C. <u>Statutory Authority</u>

This proposed regulation is being promulgated under the authority of Section 5902(h) of the State Employees' Retirement Code ("Retirement Code"), 71 Pa.C.S. Sections 5101 *et seq.*

D. Background and Purpose

This additional subsection states what information must be contained on a SERS nomination of beneficiary form in order for it to be considered valid by SERS.

E. <u>Benefits, Costs and Compliance</u>

Executive Order 1996-1 requires a cost/benefit analysis of the proposed regulation.

Benefits

The regulation is intended to alleviate confusion and prevent possible disputes with regard to proper naming of beneficiaries by members.

Costs

There are no costs to the Commonwealth, its citizens or state employees associated with this proposal.

Compliance Costs

The proposed regulation is not expected to impose any additional compliance costs.

F. <u>Sunset Review</u>

Not applicable.

G. <u>Regulatory Review</u>

Under Section 5(a) of the Regulatory Review Act (71 P.S. § 745.5(a)), on January 18, 2008, the Board submitted a copy of the proposed additional subsection to the Independent Regulatory Review Commission (IRRC) and the Chairpersons of the House State Government Committee and the Senate Finance Committee. In addition to submitting the proposed additional subsection, the Board has provided IRRC and the Committees with a detailed regulatory analysis form prepared by the Board in compliance with Executive Order 1996-1, "Regulatory Review and Promulgation". A copy of this material is available to the public upon request.

Under section 5(g) of the Regulatory Review Act, if IRRC has objections to any portion of the proposed additional subsection, it will notify the Board within 10 days of the close of the Committees' review period. The notification shall specify the regulatory review criteria that have not been met by the portion of the proposed additional subsection to which an objection has been made. The Regulatory Review Act specifies detailed procedures for review by the General Assembly and the Governor of objections raised by IRRC prior to final publication of the additional subsection by the Board.

4 Pa. Code Chapter 247

§ 247.7. Death Benefits.

- (c) <u>Beneficiary Nomination</u>. To be considered valid, any nomination of beneficiary form filed by a member after the effective date of this regulation should contain the following information, all of which should be current as of the date of the member's execution thereof:
 - (1) If a natural person is designated by the member as the member's beneficiary, included with that designation should be the name of the person along with the person's date of birth and address. (A designation solely by relationship is not a valid nomination.)
 - (2) If a trust is designated by the member as the member's beneficiary, included with that designation should be the name of the trust along with the name(s), of the trustee(s), the date the trust was established and the address(es) of the trustee(s).
 - (3) If the member's estate is designated by the member as the member's beneficiary, included with that designation should be the name(s) of the executor(s) of the estate and the address(es) of said executor(s).
 - (4) If a corporation, partnership, limited liability company, business trust, other association, governmental entity (other than the Commonwealth) or foundation is designated by the member as the member's beneficiary, included with that designation should be the full name of the corporation, partnership, limited liability company, business trust, other association, governmental entity or foundation along with the full name and address of the individual at such entity who should be contacted upon the death of the member.
