Provisions for children with "disabilities" and "English Language Learners" is certainly different to children with developmental delays or children who just need additional assistance, and it doesn't appear clear that this is being taken into consideration at all.

Additionally, I am opposed to double testing of our students. I am opposed because students in our district are already reaching proficiency in reading, math, and science either through the PSSA exams or through a comprehensive, local assessment.
