As a recent transplant to the state of Pennsylvania from the state of New York, I now take this opportunity to support the proposal to require GCAs as a requirement for graduation. New York has used exit exams for a number of years. It does not increase the drop out rate with statistics showing a constant drop out rate as the Regents exams became required for a regents diploma in the 1990s again. Previously, schools were allowed to award a "local" diploma to students that could not pass the rigorous Regents exams.

Pennsylvania needs to require the PSSA or GCAs for a graduation requirement so that students and parents will support and value the education offered in Pennsylvania.
