I am currently the Director of the Family Nurse Practitioner Program at DeSales University, a post I have held for the past 10 years.

I have participated in the various legislative efforts brought forth by CRNPs over the past two decades. I am truly heartened that the changes in the new regulations finally unbind cumbersome and illegal restrictions on CRNP practice. The demographics of our State citizens, coupled with the lack of access to quality services by *all* Pennsylvanians, dictates the imminent need to allow CRNPs to practice to the fullest extent of their legal capabilities.
