I request that you reject proposed regulation #2777 of Agriculture 2-160: Milk Sanitation. I think that citizens of Pennsylvania should be allowed to decide our preference in buying from local farmers whom we have chosen for their trustworthiness. We should definitely be allowed to decide whether we wish to buy fresh, uncooked milk. We should have the option to do so, since so many farmers are willing to meets this request. This type of decision every adult is capable of making.
