and also for keeping the  
somatic cell count limit for  
goats at 4,000,000.  
However I have a few  
concerns about pathogens test  
for raw milk.  
① That pathogen tests are  
accurate.  
② That if a farmers milk  
tests positive for pathogens  
and once the media is  
alerted (therefore resulting  
in bad publicity for such  
farmers) that once such  
farmers milk tests clean  
of pathogens, that the media  
would again be alerted  
advising such farmers milk is

CLEAN AND TIT TO DRINK.

3) It is my hope that if such pathogens tests are put into law that an awareness sheet or fact sheet would be printed by the PDA or some other entity advising where such pathogens come from, what the farmer needs to be looking for, etc.

4) I am also deeply concerned about the element of trust between city folk and country folk. I am concerned that city folk conduct there business in a way that an element of trust can be developed by country folk and again vice versa, that country folk conduct there business - that an element of trust can be developed by city folk. May you strive for balance in both writing and applying these new milk rules.
